- There are two types of financial aid: gift aid and self-help aid
- Gift aid includes grants and scholarships gifts of money to pay for college that don't have to be repaid
- Self-help aid includes employment and student loans that you will need to repay
- Financial Aid is based on demonstrated need and is designed to help students who cannot afford the cost of attending college
- Scholarships based on merit should be seen as a reward for grades, special talents, creativity, leadership, or other criteria used to select recipients





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Florida Bright Futures Program

Awarded to every student in the state of Florida who meets the eligibility requirements





- 1. Be a Florida resident and a U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen, as determined by the student's postsecondary institution.
- 2. Complete the community service requirement.
- 3. Earn a <u>standard Florida high school diploma</u> or <u>its equivalent</u>.
- 4. Be accepted by and enroll in an eligible Florida public or independent postsecondary education institution
- 5. Not have been found guilty of a felony charge.
- 6. Be enrolled for at least 6 semester credit hours (or the equivalent in quarter or clock hours).
- 7. Student initiates authorization process after December 1st of the senior year at www.FloridaStudentFinancialAid.org

Florida Academic Scholars Award

- O GPA
 - 3.5 weighted GPA in required college preparatory credits (not rounded)
- Test Scores- (Class of 2014) writing score not included
 - SAT(Reasoning Test) -1290
 - o ACT-29
 - *Scores must be achieved by June 30th of graduating year
- Required Credits
 - 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
 - 4 Math (Algebra I and/or above)
 - 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
 - 3 Social Sciences
 - 2 Foreign Language (Sequential in the same language)

Community Service requirement

100 hours

Florida Medallion Scholars • GPA Award

- 3.0 weighted GPA in required college preparatory credits (not rounded)
- Test Scores- (Class of 2014) writing score not included
 - SAT (Reasoning Test) 1170
 - O ACT-26
 - *Scores must be achieved by June 30th of graduating year
- Required Credits
 - 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
 - 4 Math (Algebra I and/or above)
 - 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
 - 3 Social Sciences
 - 2 Foreign Language (Sequential in the same language)

Community Service requirement

75 hours



- O GPA
 - 3.0 weighted GPA in the core credits required for graduation (not rounded)
 - 3.5 <u>un-weighted</u> GPA in 3 vocational credits in one vocational program (not rounded)
- <u>Test Scores</u>-writing score for SAT or ACT not included for FBF test requirement
 - PERT -104 Reading, 99 Writing, 113 Math
 - SAT (Reasoning Test)-440 Critical Reading, 440 Math ACT-17 English, 18 Reading, 19 Math-
 - *Scores must be achieved by June 30th of graduating year
- Required Credits
 - 4 English (3 with substantial writing)
 - 4 Math (including Algebra I)
 - 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
 - 3 Social Sciences (US. Government, World History, US History and Economics
 - 1 Fine or identified Practical Art OR .5 credit of each
 - HOPE (combination of PE and Health)

30 hours











- FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID
- Largest source of student aid; distributed and processed by the U.S. Department of Education
- Must be completed <u>annually</u> for federal student aid
- Available electronically or in paper format
- Available on or after January 1st of each year
- First step in the financial aid process











- Check ALL application deadlines
 - School and state deadlines* may differ from federal guidelines
- Confirm your dependency status*
- Search for school codes*
- Determine how you will submit the FAFSA
 - Electronically (up to 14 days FASTER!)
 - Electronic signature and submission requires a PIN. Establish a PIN before at www.pin.ed.gov or during the application process
 - Manually
 - Sign and mail the application to the address provided













Gather important info:

- Social Security Number
- Driver's License Number (if any)
- 2013 W-2 Forms and other records of money earned
- Student: 2013 Federal Income Tax Return
- Parent: 2013 Federal Income Tax Return (if you are a dependent student)
- 2013 untaxed income records
- Current bank statements
- Your current business and investment mortgage information, business and farm records, stock, bond and other investment records
- Alien registration or permanent resident card (if you are not a U.S. citizen)





Complete the FAFSA - Electronically

- Go to www.fafsa.gov and click on "Start A New FAFSA"
- IRS Data Retrieval Tool is available
 - US Department of Education HIGHLY recommends using this tool
- Sign and submit the electronic FAFSA with your PIN





- Received via E-mail three to five days after your FAFSA has been processed, if you provided an E-mail address when you applied
- Received by mail seven to ten days after your FAFSA has been processed, if you did not provide an E-mail address when you applied







- Contains your official Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
 - The U.S. Department of Education calculates your EFC, and sends it to the postsecondary institutions listed on your FAFSA
- The postsecondary institution will determine how much financial aid you are eligible to receive from the following formula:

Cost of Attendance (COA)
Expected Family Contribution (EFC)

= Financial Need
