Academic Achievements

- Dunedin High School offers 16 AP classes including the AP Capstone courses, which lead to an AP Capstone Diploma recognized by thousands of universities, including all the Florida public universities.
- Nearly 50% of the seniors at Dunedin High School graduate with honors.
- Dunedin High School has many National Honor Societies including: National Honor Society, Spanish National Honor Society, Tri-M-Music National Honor Society.
- Dunedin High School has a graduation rate of more than 85%, well above the State and National graduation rate.
- Nearly 30% of the students at Dunedin High School take at least one Advanced Placement course each year.
- On average, 1/3 of the seniors graduate with a weighted GPA of 3.5 or above.
- 10% of DHS students graduate with either an industry certification or a state professional license.

Points of Pride

- The DHS Yearbook has won national awards for the past two years for Excellence in Cover Design and Outstanding Student Journalism.
- The DHS Falconaires, Madrigals, Wind Ensemble and Jazz Band have all earned superior ratings for the past six years.
- For the last two years the DHS Grade 4 Pipe Band has been undefeated in competitions against bands from all over the Southeast.
- In the Skills USA vocational skills competition for the State of Florida, DHS students earned a 1st place in Cosmetology and a 2nd place in Architectural Drafting.
- The Dunedin High School Wrestling Team won a Regional Championship and had four District Champions and one Regional Champion.
- The Falcon Baseball Team made it to the final 8 last year and had the highest GPA of any Baseball team in Pinellas County and the second highest GPA in the state.
- The distinguished NJROTC unit at DHS is ranked in the top 20 worldwide and the Orienteering Team has placed top 3 in the state for five of the past six years.
