Directions for Completing the Calendars

Summer is upon us – and with that comes what some call the "summer slide" in students' academic skills while out of school. There are things that you as a parent can do to take charge and make learning a priority during the long hot days of summer. Experts agree that children who continue learning during the summer gain reading, math, science and social study skills that will prepare them for the new school year.

So let's get started.....

Students will receive a summer calendar from their teacher before school closes for summer. Each calendar is filled with activities for each day of the week (excluding weekends) to keep students focused on the core content areas. Students are expected to finish 70 % of all the activities provided. There are 50 activities, every student must complete a minimum of 35 activities for their calendar and 12 days of reading on the Reading Log each month to be considered completed. Most of the activities can be done at home, in summer programs, camps and on vacations. When students return to school on August 24, 2015 they will turn in their calendars to their new teacher for the 2015-2016 school year. Each school will be collecting calendars and the school with the highest percentage of completed calendars will win a prize.

Parents: Each day an activity is completed the parent, guardian or adult who is responsible for supervising the student will initial the calendar somewhere in the daily box or you can sign the bottom of the calendar for each month, verifying the student has completed the activity. Adults can help students with the activity and participate in the fun of doing the activity but should <u>not do</u> the activity for the student. We will be posting reminders on the district website for students to keep working as well as principal messages via the PCS telephone or text messaging system.

Students: Each week you should preview your activities and plan your days so you can complete the 35 activities by August 28, 2015. These can be done at home, on vacation, or in Summer Bridge, if you are attending. Adults can help you but they cannot do the work for you. Take your time and think about each activity and make sure you do your best work!

A few important things.....

Summer Reading with the Rays- visit your local library and choose your favorite books to read over the summer, ask the librarian for a summer Reading with the Rays scorecard. As you read, track your hours by rounding the bases on the scorecard. You can collect Rays rewards along the way. When you read enough hours to get to first base, ask your parent or guardian to initial your card; then bring it to your local library for a reward.
