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Hello Parents!

Election season is well underway. There are many important decisions to be made at the top this year. There is another important decision to be made at the county level, and I wanted to share this information with you as they affect our schools.

Voting ballots in November will include a vote on "Referendum" 2016". The Referendum strengthens reading, music and art programs; provides up-to-date technology; and helps recruit and retain quality teachers.

Pinellas County voters have supported the half-mill property tax three times since 2004, all times by large margins. An independent committee meets regularly to oversee the distribution of funds and ensure that money is spent as voters intended.

The Referendum also:

- Supports all students through new or expanded classroom libraries, additional supplies, increased training opportunities for teachers, and updated computers and technology.
- Funds intensive small-group literacy programs that help students read at grade level, instrument rental fees for students that can't afford them, and paid admission for field trips to museums and art galleries.
- Provides all schools with equitable funding for quality art supplies, equipment and technology that help students produce strong and award-winning works of art.
 - Supplies instruments for elementary music classes, and equipment such as furniture, risers and music stands to ensure equity among music programs throughout the district.
- Helps recruit and retain quality teachers: Eighty percent of the Referendum revenue supplements teacher salaries. For the 2016-17 school year, the supplement will provide teachers with an additional \$3,827.

Thank you for allowing me to share this information with you. Your voice matters, and it counts. No matter how you vote in November, I hope you will make your voice heard. Hope to see all of you on campus soon!

What is Bullying?
The Pinellas County Schools Policy against Bullying and Harassment defines bullying as: Systematically and chronically inflicting physical hurt or psychological distress on one or more students or employees. In bullying situations there are always 3 key elements present:

Imbalance of Power Intent to Harm Repeated Behavior

Bullying/Harassment at school can be reported:

Verbally or in writing to the principal or the principal's designee

Musical Moments



K-1 are learning basic keyboarding (piano) skills. How to hold their hands correctly and identify the patterns of black keys. They are learning how to keep a steady beat. If you have a piano or keyboard at home I would encourage you to sit with your child and discover patterns and practice hand placement.

2nd - Singing and Playing Sol-Mi patterns on Orff instruments

3rd - Learning notes B and A on the Recorder. **Warning, when the kids do bring them home, they cannot forget to bring them back for their music day. If the Recorder is absent on their music day they will get a written warning.

4th- Musical contour has been our latest discussion. The "shape" of the melody they hear. At home practice would be to take a pencil to paper and follow the melody of a song they hear being played. Probably would have them listen first, then try to draw in air with hand and then use paper and pencil. **5th**- Using Orff instruments playing Mallet Madness

Chorus- preparing for auditions and will soon begin choreography.

Art Room News



We have been very busy in the art room during the month of September!

Kindergarten has been working with lines and shapes to complete a scarecrow collage.

First Grade has been working on using patterns in their art while working on a picture of overlapping hands. **Second Grade** has been working on how artists use texture in their art. We drew a charcoal drawing of a teddy bear and then drew an animal of our choice showing texture.

Third Grade has been working on showing space (distance) in their art while working on a scarecrow drawing. After drawing a scarecrow from observation they drew the scene around their scarecrow using their imagination. Our third grade scarecrows ended up in some pretty interesting places!

Fourth Grade has been learning about contour line drawing, gestures and shading. We worked on a contour line drawing of our shoe and are now working on a gesture drawing using oil pastels to learn more about shading.

Fifth Grade has been working very hard to plan and organize both a piece of art work and writing on the theme "On My Block". I love hearing and seeing all the stories describing unique and interesting places in their neighborhood or home.

I will be sending home an introductory letter and information about Artsonia in the coming weeks. Artsonia is the largest student online art museum in the world. It will allow you to share your child's art with friends and relatives and begin creating an electronic portfolio of your child's work. I will begin uploading art that we are doing in the art room to each child's art gallery page soon.
