

HOW TO APPLY

Students living south of Ulmerton Road can apply to this program during the designated application period. Students who live south of State Road 60/Gulf-to-Bay Boulevard and north of Ulmerton Road can apply to either Gulf Beaches' or Kings Highway's Center for Innovation and Digital Learning, but not both.

TRANSPORTATION

Students who live more than two miles away from the school and in the zones for 74th Street, Azalea or Bear Creek elementary schools will be eligible for arterial transportation, which provides bus stops close to main roads.

Parents of students living outside of the identified school zones may request space-available transportation from an existing arterial bus stop within the identified zones by calling 727-587-2020.

MANDATORY MODIFIED DRESS CODE

A modified dress code is mandatory at Gulf Beaches Elementary Magnet School. Boys and girls must wear collared shirts. The color choices are forest green, navy blue and white. Boys and girls must wear khaki bottoms. Shorts are permitted. Girls may wear jumpers.
