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### A note from Mrs. Buckles.....

Dear Pioneer Families,

Happy New Year! I hope you enjoyed your holiday break. Welcome back to Garrison-Jones for the second semester. Our schedule remains busy and we appreciate the support of our parent community.

Parents often ask me what they can do at home to support their child's education in respect to the new core standards.

The Florida Standards provide clear expectations for what your child should know and be able to do in reading, writing, speaking, listening, language, and mathematics. If you know what these expectations are, then you can work with the teacher and help prepare your child for the challenge.

Find ways to make reading fun. A few suggestions to provide home support is to read non-fiction books and articles with your child, such as biographies or historical stories. Ask your child's teacher for a list of grade level non-fiction books titles. When reading with your child, ask them to make sense of what they read and draw their own conclusions. Providing this time at home will help reinforce how to dig deeper into difficult pieces. When it comes to writing or retelling a story, ask your child to use evidence from their reading to support what they say. Moreover, ask your child to provide evidence in everyday discussions. You can also do this in writing activities from what they read. Write together using evidence and details. Make it a game – taking turns using evidence. Helping to strengthen your child's vocabulary and reinforce that language is power!

In mathematics homework, encourage your child to show their work and explain how they arrived at their answer. Spend time helping them practice and memorize math facts. This type of home support will help provide success in more advanced math problems. Find opportunities to do the math that they encounter in daily life. Help your child to use math in real world situations such as recipes or determining how much pizza to order or how much of tip to include on the restaurant check. Children need to see that math is all around them.

You are the most important influence in your child's life. This type of home support will help your child's academic success in the classroom.

### IMPORTANT SCHOOL SAFETY NEWS

Each day the faculty and staff of Garrison-Jones Elementary strive to ensure a safe learning environment for all students. One of our primary methods of preparation in the event of an emergency is to practice safety drills on a consistent basis. So far this year our students have had the opportunity practice exiting the building each month in an orderly fashion during our fire drills. We have also provided students with the opportunity to practice a duck and cover drill in the event of severe weather and a lockdown drill in the event of a campus emergency. This ongoing practice helps us to proactively review our plans and refine our systems. We will be continuing our monthly fire drills and will be repeating our other safety drills during the second half of the school year. Please consider talking with your students about the importance of safety drills. For some students these drills can sometimes cause concern or anxiety. Your support not only helps the students to review the expectations, but also provides a positive home school connection while reminding them that all of us are here to maintain their safety.

In addition to our safety drills, our faculty and staff often review our safety protocols for campus activities and events. We recognize that two or our busiest activities, arrival and dismissal, occur daily and require adult supervision. Many of our faculty and staff support the safety of our students by rotating at posts around our school. These adults open car doors, help with busses, monitor the café, and remind students to walk in transition to and from class, etc. Each morning our faculty and staff assume their duty stations at 8:15am and remain on post until the second bell rings. We need your help to ensure that students are safe each morning and are asking all parents and families to please be cognizant of arrival times. If you are experiencing a need to drop your child off earlier than supervised hours begin, please let our office staff know and we can help to put you in touch with one of the many before and after care programs that are available at our school. We wish all of you a safe and healthy 2015.

Homework help is available from 5pm to 8 pm, Monday through Thursday, on all school days, except when there is no school the following day.



# 7 Ways to Motivate Children

- Set proper expectations have high expectations and communicate them to your child. Base your expectations on your child as an individual who has strengths and weaknesses.
- 2. Help your child set goals make them specific and measureable, and write them down.
- 3. Show your child that you think school is important.
- Support your child's learning style

- Speak the language of encouragement – notice effort and progress, not perfection.
- Reinforce learning at home and in the community - activities that can increase their knowledge and understanding are also lots of fun.
- 7. Encourage your child to be resilient by empathizing with them, providing reasonable choices, changing your approach when it isn't work-

### **Speech**

On Tuesday, **January 27<sup>th</sup> 2015** the annual vision and hearing screening will be conducted at Garrison-Jones. Those who will be tested are:

- kindergarten and 1st grade will be testing for hearing and vision
- 3<sup>rd</sup> grade will be vision only (unless new to the county then hearing is also done)
- all new to county students
- and teacher referrals.

Parents will be notified only if your child does not pass the screening. You will be notified of a vision failure, by letter, soon after the screening. Hearing failures will be rechecked 2 to 3 weeks after the initial screening. This allows time for illnesses such as colds, which may temporarily affect hearing, to clear. You will be notified by letter of a hearing failure.

If you do not wish to have your child participate in the screening or would like to refer your child for the screening, please notify the school in writing by January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2015 (attention: Ms. Lindsey Wegner) or email Ms. Wegner at wegnerma@pcsb.org.
