I love this time of year! We go from taking the time to reflect on all we are thankful for to the winter holiday season. The ads try to take us to a busy, materialistic place which can make anyone stressed especially our children. So, I'm making a conscious effort to take those deep breaths and stay calm.

On the note of the holidays, I'd like to pass on a family tradition we started when my oldest was 7 (he's 35 now). We began a Christmas journal (could be any holiday or winter journal). In the journal I wrote about the events happening that year and the gifts we exchanged. As we were packing up the decorations, I always asked what everyone's favorite thing was about that year. PTA Corner

TO SCREEN OR NOT

Ever wonder how much screen time is too much for kids? Even tech gurus like Apple founder Steve Jobs and Twitter founder Evan Williams strictly regulate what and how much their kids are doing on screens. Some parents have developed time limits, from nothing at all to 30 minutes a day for weeknights, an hour a day for weekends. Many parents do not allow screens at the dinner table, and, interestingly, the number one rule among tech parents is: no screens in the bedroom, ever.

However, most experts agree that there is a difference between time spent consuming (watching YouTube or playing video games, for example), and time spent creating (reading on a tablet, doing math, creating art, or even playing a computer programming game like Minecraft). Not only are there many excellent educational programs and apps out there for kids, some experts think that outright forbidding screens can pose potential problems later in life. If kids are not exposed and taught how to handle screen time responsibly, they may go overboard and become addicted to video games when they are older.

In short, a little, carefully monitored screen time can be beneficial to kids. Below is a short list of educational apps, programs, tv shows and websites:


