Building Your Child's Self-Esteem

Children who have high self-esteem come to value themselves and think of themselves as worthy and capable. With a healthy self-esteem, children feel that they have positive characteristics and skills they can offer to other people, and they also feel they are worthy of being loved and accepted by others including family and friends.

Here are 10 ways to help build your child's self-esteem:

1. **Be realistic**. Don't berate your child for not being "perfect." Don't think you have to be the best parent in the world.

2. Be the best role model you can be. Your child watches you every second you're together. He or she will do as you do, not as


you say, so "do" the best you can.

3. Talk with your child, not at him or her. Show respect for your child's opinion

4. **Openly give your love with hugs, kisses, and praise**. The more a child feels loved, the more he or she will listen to you.
