What is the focus of Montessori education?


The focus of our education system is the development of materials, educational techniques, and observations which support the natural development of the child. In our public school Montessori, the students are taught the state standards using the Montessori method. The teacher in the Montessori classroom serves less as an "instructor" and more as a guide and facilitator. Children are encouraged to "learn how to learn", thus gaining independence and self-confidence.

How will my child adjust to a traditional classroom in 6th grade?

Montessori students develop a love of learning and use their strengths in order to take in new information. The students take their organization skills and their ability to meet deadlines into the new environment. There will be some adjustments to the learning environment; however, the desire to explore new academic avenues can be met within the traditional classroom if the teacher is enthusiastic and provides the opportunity for learning. The sense of discovery will differ when lessons are presented to the whole group instead of allowing the students the joy of discovering new information through their own work.

When you volunteer, also please log your volunteer hours on the computer in the school's front office. We will be happy to help you with the log-in process. Volunteer hours should be recorded each time you volunteer.

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Classroom Update



December 17th at 9:30 a.m., Mrs. Freeman's & Mrs. Forte's second grade classes marched a half mile to the Gulfport Public Library. Students and teachers paraded down 22nd Avenue accompanied by a parent volunteer. Co-teacher Mrs. Davidson led the way across the flashing safety crosswalk at Beach Blvd. Passing that landmark sign, student pairs continued through the park, admiring sculptures, and going beyond Gulfport Senior Center/Theater.

Arriving at 10 a.m., Ms. Cailey met us just as the community library was opening. An enthusiastic librarian, she invited our group to the reading garden for a story about a wee, winged creature called a Snatchabook, who is not scary at all and longing for someone to read to him. Students listened attentively and discussed the plot and characters respectfully.

One boy in our class returned the next day to participate in Reading to a Therapy Dog. Another student remarked her family was planning to use library computers over the break and she was excited about getting her own library card. Thanking our librarians for expanding our world, hungry for knowledge and adventure, we walked back to school.






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
