Montessori School News

I hope we saw you at the first Montessori Monday held on October 13th. Some of Ms. Dawson's children presented materials to the parents in attendance. It was great to see the materials in action! We discussed a bit about Maria Montessori and the materials she developed. The next Montessori Monday is scheduled for November 10th at 6:00 p.m. Plan on attending so you can meet other Montessori families and share in your child's excitement of Montessori!

What is Montessori like in the public school? Since we are a Pinellas county magnet school we are following the Florida standards and the district guidelines. As you have seen, there is a district magnet commitment form that spells out the expectations of your child, your family and the teacher. An Intervention committee meets once a month to review students who are not following the guidelines. That committee has parent representation, the teacher, the Montessori coordinator and administration. We look at potential ways that the child can meet the guidelines to be successful. After the meeting, Mrs. Ludlum then contacts the parents to notify them of decisions. You can refer to the guidelines on the back of your copy of the magnet commitment agreement for specific details of infractions and expectations.

What are the subject areas in the Montessori classroom? Math, Language and Cultural

Montessori lessons are taught from the concrete to the abstract. In math we use materials that allow the child to understand number sense and then move to working problems on paper using the methods that were taught.

Language materials are used in the same way. Grammar lessons teach parts of speech (nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns, prepositions, conjunctions) and sentence analysis (diagramming sentences). Word study teaches compound words, antonyms, synonyms and others with cards.

Cultural lessons are lessons given in science, social studies, geography and history. We give the children lessons to help them see the universe and their place within it. Again there are materials used to teach those lessons.

Children have individualized work plans, and progress to next levels as they are successful.

Let me know if you have any suggestions for future Montessori sessions or magnet questions.



THINGS TO DO IN DOWNTOWN ST. PETE

Saturday Morning Market: The largest outdoor market in the Southeast, with dozens of vendors offering produce, clothing, jewelry, local made products. There are food trucks and live music, as well. Just off the Pinellas Trail, if you feel like biking. Located next to Al Lang Stadium, Saturdays 9-2.

Morean Arts Center: On Saturdays there is a free art exploration program for families with children aged 5-10. Saturdays, 10-4.

Dali Museum: Every Thursday evening from 5-8 the museum offers discounted ticket prices.

The Florida Orchestra: The orchestra is now offering free tickets to any child under age 18, with a paying adult. \$10 student tickets are available also, regardless of age.

Times Festival of Reading: Local and nationally known authors talk about their books, sign autographs, etc. For all ages. Saturday, October 25, 10am-4pm, USF St. Pete campus.

Blue Ocean Film Festival and Conservation Summit: This is the inaugural year for this festival in St. Petersburg. Hollywood stars will be in attendance, there will be concerts, films, and lots more. November 2-9, various locations. Visit blueocean-filmfestival.org for more information.
