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Bus News

Our bus drivers and bus assistants play a critical part in safely getting your children to and from school. As you can imagine, this is a very complex process, and we appreciate working in partnership with you to help it run smoothly!



A few reminders:

- Students should be at their stop 10-15 minutes before the scheduled pick-up time. With absent riders and varying traffic patterns, we need to stay as close to the scheduled route as possible to get students to school on time.
- Please be at the stop 10-15 minutes prior to the scheduled drop-off time. In the event that the
 bus is a little earlier than scheduled, it is often stressful for students to have to sit and wait for
 the person who is meeting the bus. Also, many locations are not suitable for buses to sit and
 block traffic for extended periods of time.
- If your child will not be riding for a day or other period of time, please communicate that to the bus staff. They can then adjust the route and let other parents and guardians know so that the route still runs smoothly.

Just a friendly reminder for you to be a current volunteer.

If you are a returning volunteer, you do not have to fill out a new volunteer registration form. All you need to do is "activate" in the volunteer system in Focus prior to volunteering. Please **DO NOT** activate using any mobile device. To do so may result in an **INELIGIBLE** volunteer status.

To activate your volunteer profile, go to https://focus.pcsb.org/focus. Log in using your v.account: (last name first initial - all lowercase)* and password: Last name (Capitalize first letter), followed by your 4-digit birth year.

Example:

Login: v.smitha

Password: Smith 1973

*Please note: Focus will add additional letters to a volunteer's Username if another PCS volunteer shares a common last name. If you experience difficulty signing in Focus, please contact me for assistance.

Click on the "Volunteer" button in the upper left hand corner, Click on "Add Hours", answer the questions, and don't forget to log your hours. (It is highly recommended that volunteers should NOT re-activate using a mobile device, as this method has been known to input the answers to the criminal offense questions incorrectly.)
