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Clinic Corner

As we enter the time of year when respiratory illnesses become more prevalent, please remember these health tips:

- Wash your hands often with **soap and water** for 20 seconds. •
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands. •
- Avoid close contact such as kissing, hugging and sharing cups or eating utensils with • people who are sick.
- Cover your coughs and sneezes with a tissue or shirt sleeve NOT with your hands.
- Clean and disinfect all frequently touched surfaces, such as toys and • doorknobs. Increase the frequency of cleaning if someone is sick.
- Stay home when you are sick, and keep your child home if they show signs of illness. This • is the best way to prevent the spread of illnesses. Also remember if your child has a fever (100 degrees or higher) they must be fever free without medication 24 hours PRIOR to returning to school.

Following these tips can help to slow the spread of many illnesses - common cold, flu, enterovirus, and other pathogens that can lead to disease.

We hope these tips will be helpful and that you find health and happiness this new school year.




New Sensory Room

Behavior Tip

Managing behavior that is challenging can be very stressful for parents of children and adults with special needs, but it's important to see it as a form of communication. Challenging behavior indicates there is a problem in learning and *not* in the person.

The following idea is just a suggestion for managing behavior.

Use a Break Card. A break card can be useful for averting meltdowns. It gives a person the means to communicate their wish to leave an unpleasant situation. They simply need to hand the card over. A break card is useful in school or out and about.

If you are a returning volunteer, you do not have to fill out a new volunteer registration form. All you need to do is **"activate"** in the volunteer system in Focus prior to volunteering. Please **DO NOT** activate using any mobile device. To do so may result in an **INELIGIBLE** volunteer status.

To activate your volunteer profile, go to <u>https://focus.pcsb.org/focus</u>. Log in using your v.account: (last name first initial - all lowercase)* and password: Last name (Capitalize first letter), followed by your 4-digit birth year.

Example:

Login: v.smitha Password: Smith1973



*Please note: Focus will add additional letters to a volunteer's Username if another PCS volunteer shares a common last name. If you experience difficulty signing in Focus, please contact me for assistance.

Click on the "Volunteer" button in the upper left hand corner, Click on "Add Hours", answer the questions, and don't forget to log your hours. (It is highly recommended that volunteers should NOT re-activate using a mobile device, as this method has been known to input the answers to the criminal offense questions incorrectly.)

**Any volunteer that did not log any hours last school year: your profile has been deactivated and archived. To be reinstated in Focus, please email Rose Egnacheski, Volunteer Coordinator: <u>egnacheskir@pcsb.org</u>

If you have never been a registered volunteer in Pinellas County Schools, then you will need to fill out a Volunteer form and provide a state photo ID. Rose will process the paperwork and let you know when you have been approved to be a volunteer.
