

Welcome to the 2015-2016 school year. The Physical Education Department is looking forward to an exciting and rewarding year. To ensure all students are safe and successful please review the rules and procedures listed below. **OVERVIEW: Pre-K students will have outdoor Physical Education class daily for thirty minutes. Kindergarten through Fifth Grade students will have outdoor Physical Education class three days a week for forty five minutes.** These classes are supervised and instructed by one of the four members of the P.E. staff. The curriculum is based on Pinellas County Physical Education Curriculum Guidelines and on individual assessment of your child's skills and needs.

**MISSION STATEMENT:** To educate and prepare students for physical activity now and in the future while enhancing each student's overall physical fitness level.

ATTIRE: For your child's safety, the P.E. Department requests rubber soled shoes that stay on your child's feet. We request no boots, highheeled shoes, spikes or sandals be worn. If your child wants to wear these shoes to school, we ask that he/she change before coming out to P.E. class. We also request girls wear shorts under dresses. Hats are permitted, please no sunglasses or jewelry due to safety concerns. Sunscreen is highly recommended.

WATER BOTTLES: Please send a water bottle to school, labeled with your child's name. It is very hot outside and it is important your child stays hydrated.

**EXCUSES:** ALL students will be expected to participate in all P.E. activities unless they present a note from a parent/guardian or doctor. If a student misses P.E. for more than three days in a row, a doctor's note is required. In instances such as hospitalization, long-term illness, broken bones, and stitches, we will require a doctor's release note. The note must be given to the P.E. instructor before the child may resume participation.

**GRADING:** Your child receives a grade in both skill and behavior each grading period. If your child is earning an "N" (Needs Improvement) for the grading period, the P. E. instructor will notify you.

- 1. Listen and follow directions
- 2. Respect others
- 3. Use P.E. equipment properly

4.Demonstrate good sportsmanship and participation



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## **BATTLING THE BACK-TO-SCHOOL BLUES**

Parents can make the first days of school fun rather than frustrating

Too frequently, children begin the school year unprepared to succeed, quickly experience frustration and failure, and get turned-off to learning. However, kids can love instead of loath the first days of school; they just need a little help from mom and dad. Here's how:

Tip #1: Give your children the gift of chores. Children who regularly do chores at home find it much easier to do assignments at school. Why? When parents deliver sincere doses of empathy or sadness before describing consequences, their children learn responsibility rather than resentment. A parent might say:

How sad ... I love you so much, but you forgot to clean your bathroom today. Now I don't have the energy to take you swimming. This really stinks.

#### Tip #3: Limit television, videos, videogames, and other "entertaining" activities.

Children who are used to being entertained during the summer by fast-paced TV shows, movies, games, and trips to the amusement park go into shock when they enter the classroom. Before long, they begin to complain about how "boring" their teachers are and how much they dislike school. #### Tip #4: Have fun with reading and writing.

During the first week of school, teachers can always tell the difference between the children who've been read to during the summer and those who have not.
