Campus Locked

The campus will be locked and closed at 4:00 each day. If a student forgets a book, homework, or anything else at school, they will not be permitted to go back to the classroom.

Bus Business

Here is some good information to know for bus riders:

If a bus rider wants a friend to go home with him/her, the friend cannot ride the bus. Even if the friend is a bus rider on another bus, they still are not permitted to go on a bus other than the one to which they are assigned.

Students who are not bus riders cannot ride the bus. Parents and unauthorized adults are not permitted by law to board a bus. Students are expected to wear a seatbelt, remain seated and keep their hands to themselves during the ride. Students are expected to listen and follow the driver's instructions.

Students are expected to listen and jollow the ariver's instructions. Students may only board and exit the bus at the stops the district has assigned to them.

Following these tips will keep students safe.

Cafeteria

- We welcome parents to eat lunch with their children. When eating outside you may only take your own child from the cafeteria.
- Cafe expectations for students:
 - Use restaurant manners.
 - Use indoor voices.
 - Raise your hand.
 - Walk when movement is permitted.
 - Clear off table and line up in an orderly manner.



Pinellas County Schools encourages volunteerism! The school district recognizes that volunteers promote family and community involvement and provide meaningful experiences for students. We love and need our Brooker Creek Volunteers and there are many ways to get engaged at our school!

Pinellas County School Board policies require that all volunteers undergo a Criminal background screening. Board policies also require that Certain volunteers, those who have unsupervised Contact with students, undergo Level II screening, an additional level of screening that involves fingerprinting. This requirement pertains to all volunteers who have unsupervised Contact with students, including chaperones, drivers and volunteer Coaches.

ALL Returning volunteers must re-activate their volunteer status every year regardless of level and prior to volunteering and attending field trips. You can choose to update your status from home or at any school, but please do not attempt from cell phone. To activate please follow the steps below:

Go to <u>https://portal.pcsb.org/focus/</u> from home or click on the icon from school computer.

You will need to enter your v.account and password to reactivate.

*Your log-on name will be: v.(period)last name followed by first name initial

(example: V.smithj). If first initial only does not work due to commonality of last name try first 2 initials, and so on until it comes up (example: V.smithje).

*Your password will be: Last name (Capitalize the first letter, the rest lower Case) followed by birth year (example: Smith1978)

*Click on volunteer, located at the top left under the word FOCUS

*Click on add hours

*Complete the questions.

Technology News: Why is Keyboarding Important?


