 - The ESOL department partnered with the High Point Neighborhood Family Center to host the Career Day/Day of Design for ELL students.

This event for ESOL students from St. Pete and Northeast high schools took place on Thursday, March 19th at the HPNFC. The program provided opportunities for ESOL students to learn about careers, network with local business owners, learn about entrepreneurship and find out what to expect after graduation. Students learned about SPC and explored career opportunities at the college, including the science and technology programs.

They also participated in career activities by the Art Institutes, learned about available programs and took a personality test to determine their career interests.

Students also learned about sewing, art and photography from local business owners who volunteered their time to share their experiences and participate in crafts with the ESOL students. One of the business owners was a former ESOL student who completed a PTEC program. He now owns and runs a successful barber shop in Clearwater. Several of our students received free haircuts while listening to his inspirational story. Students also received free haircuts and manicures from the Regency Beauty Institute. In addition, the Academy of Animal Arts awarded 3 ESOL students each a \$3,500 scholarship to attend their program after high school graduation.
