



Motivation – If you are not motivated and have a poor attitude, your study session will not be very productive.

You have just one opportunity to pass that Geometry exam or ace the term paper. Pick a time of day where you can get motivated to prepare for tests, write essays, and solve problems.

Concentration — The ability to concentrate is one of the more important study skills you need to develop. You won't always be able

to study in absolute silence. Learn how to overcome distractions.
