- Our Culinary Academy has expanded. We added a brand new restaurant, added a classroom and hired a new Chef. Our Chef Tara Bishop has been an Executive Pastry Chef, with over ten years of experience, working at the Dolphin and Swan Resorts in Disney World and most recently at the Don Cesar on St. Pete Beach. Our expansion will allow us to serve more students within our population and attract others from around the district.
- The Academy of Entertainment Arts is scheduled to have a complete remodel beginning at the end of this school year. The remodeling will completely change the interior space of the building and provide the logistics, classrooms, storage and room for the programs unique art curriculum to flourish and reflect the extraordinary work that is produced by our students.

A mural of sketches were drawn and painted by Academy students at the end of last year around the building— a new sign was installed on the building as well, marking its prominence and location on our campus.
