

Sample Parent Notification:  
Corrective Action

Dear Parent,

Your child attends \_\_\_\_\_ Elementary School which receives federal Title I funds to assist students in meeting state achievement standards. Your child's school has not met these standards for four years and did not meet state standards in reading and mathematics in the 2008-2009 school year. \_\_\_\_\_ Elementary School has been identified as a School in Corrective Action. As a result, the district must offer your child the option to transfer to a school that is not identified as a School in Need of Improvement or to participate in free tutoring (if eligible). In addition, the district will improve your child's school by introducing targeted curriculum, increasing district oversight, and extending the school year or day at your child's school.

The table below shows the percent of proficient students in your child's school compared to the average percentage of proficient elementary school students in the district and state.

**What are we doing about it?**

The Pinellas County School District is providing the following assistance and support to increase the academic achievement of all students at your child's school:

- Providing professional development for all instructional staff
- Implementing a high quality curriculum for all students and effective tutoring for qualifying students
- Working closely with the school to identify and provide resources that help all students make learning gains

- Providing regular communication to parents regarding their child's progress
- Offering an after-school tutoring program to eligible students
- Using small group instruction, hands-on strategies, remediation, and data analysis to improve teaching and learning
- Working with the district, community, and families to ensure that all students receive the best education possible

- Encouraging your child's academic progress in school

**What are your Choice options?**

Under the federal No Child Left Behind (NCLB) law, when a school has been identified as a School in Corrective Action, parents have the following options for the 2009-2010 school year:

- **You may choose to have your child remain at \_\_\_\_\_ Elementary School.** If your child remains at his/her current school and is eligible for free or reduced-priced lunch, he/she may be eligible to receive **free tutoring** through the Supplemental Educational Services (SES) program for the 2009-2010 school year. This free tutoring is an opportunity for your child to receive additional instruction in the areas of greatest need. **We will send you additional information about free tutoring in the near future.**

Or

- **You may choose to transfer your child to one of the schools listed below with transportation provided by the district.** If demand for transportation exceeds available funds, transportation will be prioritized based on the lowest achieving students.
