What is the Take Stock in Children Program?

The Take Stock in Children scholarship program is for students that qualify for free/reduced lunch, earn C's or higher in their classes, have good attendance, good behavior, and have additional risk factors that make achieving a college or technical school education after high school a challenge.

Our program is based on the principal that given extensive support, motivation and accountability, children will work hard to ensure that they graduate from high school and attain a college or technical school degree.

Take Stock in Children Pinellas scholarship recipients receive:

- <u>A Scholarship</u> A tuition-only Florida Prepaid College Scholarship, which can be used at any university, college, or vocational/technical school approved by Florida Prepaid.
 Value – up to \$14,000
- <u>A Mentor</u> A volunteer mentor who will meet with you weekly at school, with cooperation from the school and parent (s), to assist and encourage you to achieve your full potential.
- A College Success Coach A Take Stock staff person will help you design a college success plan and guide you through your middle and high school transition and in to college.

How to Apply

If you would like to **complete an application for your student**, who must be in grades 6 - 10 to become part of the Take Stock in Children scholarship program, go to the following link and complete the application form within the application acceptance timeframe of **September 5**, **2017 through January 26**, **2018**.

Reminder: Total income *before* taxes, social security, health benefits, union dues, or other deductions must be reported.

Qualified financial document options **REQUIRED** with the scholarship application are as follows: **(only 1 is necessary & student's name must be listed):**

- Most recent 1040 tax return (pages 1 & 2, must show student applicant as a dependent) or
- Federal Food Assistance Document (listing student applicant as eligible) or
- Social Security Income or
- Proof of guardianship for students that are considered wards of the state (may be considered)
