*The Pinellas Technical College School Advisory Council (SAC) is composed of representatives of business and civic and community organizations; the campus directors; an instructor, a staff member, and student representatives elected by their peers from each campus.*

The majority of the members are persons who are not employed by the school district. The composition of the SAC is mandated by the Florida State Statute, Title XLVIII, Chapter 1001.452 to be reflective of the community the school serves. The SAC aids in the annual process of needs assessment, data review, and development of improvement objectives that focus on preparation of students to fill jobs in demand in the community.

In addition to the SAC, each training program has an occupational program advisory committee or apprenticeship committee comprised of professionals working in the area of the specific training program. Input from these committees ensures that desirable, relevant, and current practices are taught for each program.

The SAC and program committees are an extremely important element of Pinellas Technical College’s success, bringing the expertise of more than 250 business and professional organizations to the Pinellas Technical College career education mission.

## “Pinellas Superintendent chosen as the Florida Association for Career and Technical Education Supt. of the Year” July 17, 2018

Pinellas County Schools Superintendent Dr. Michael A. Grego was selected as the 2018 Florida Association for Career and Technical Education Superintendent of the Year. The announcement was made at the 52nd annual FACTE conference held in Orlando, Florida.



Under Dr. Grego's leadership, Pinellas students are exposed to increased opportunities for career exploration, preparation and investigation. At the district's high schools and technical colleges, academy programs are helping students earn certifications and job skills necessary for success in their desired career fields.

“There is so much value in career and technical education. The district's new technical high school, career academies and programs and STEM clubs are creating new opportunities for students,” said Michael A. Grego, Ed.D, superintendent

of Pinellas County Schools. “This award acknowledges the work of the district's hardworking career and technical education teachers and administrators and the progress of our school district growing wthese programs.”

Pinellas has seen tremendous growth in industry certifications at all levels. Students enrolled in the district's career and technical education programs have better GPAs, attendance and graduation rates. There are 72 programs (including 40 career academies) in Pinellas high schools that serve more than 22,000 students. Career academies are playing a critical role in closing the achievement gap as well. The district plans to open its first technical high school for the 2018-19 school year.

## “Pinellas County High School Seniors Participate in National Technical College Signing Day at Pinellas Technical College”

To get the training they need to be career ready in just a year, 150 of Pinellas county's high schools seniors, converged on the technical college. These students understand that in today's job market those with the skills that employers are seeking immediately are the ones that will end up with jobs right out of school. To show their commitment to that ideal, these students signed their letters of intent.

National Technical College Signing Day is a professional, sports-style signing event where students commit to the technical college. Students were welcomed on each campus by college staff and special guests alike. Each campus held its own event complete with guest speakers, a signing ceremony, and a luncheon provided by the culinary programs. All students were rewarded for their participation with a \$200 scholarship. Additionally, every program offered a \$500 scholarship to one lucky recipient.

## “Will Allen Helps Kick off Urban Agriculture Program at Pinellas Technical College”

Situated in the heart of St. Petersburg, Pinellas Technical College (PTC) is growing with the community. PTC is converting an underutilized portion of the campus into an urban agriculture hub. Will Allen of *Growing Power*, and author of *The Good Food Revolution: Growing Healthy Food, People, and Communities* came to St. Petersburg to help harness and guide the tremendous energy and interest growing in urban agriculture. Mr. Allen's expertise is invaluable to our city and his background in implementing training, outreach and technical assistance in developing community food systems provides a perfect template.

The new “Food Systems Center” operates under PTC's Office of Workforce Innovation and will provide a variety of classes based in urban agriculture, food business entrepreneurship, and cooperative development. The center will serve as an innovative hub and will foster continued facilitation of partnerships between local food systems actors.

## “New Pinellas Technical College Facility Ushers in the Technical College Renaissance”

The majority of workers in hands-on, skilled industries are aging out of the system. This is a conversation going on all across the country, not just in Florida. In a recent CBS news article, Mark Strassman discussed the worker shortage with Norm Abram of “This Old House” and Mike Rowe of “Dirty Jobs” The need for skilled workers across the country, in many manufacturing and technical industries, is immense.

In an effort to keep pace with the growing need, Pinellas Technical College (PTC) is undergoing a nearly \$20 million dollar renovation of its Clearwater campus, with a renovation of the St. Petersburg campus to be undertaken in the near future.

# what we impact

## Economic Impact – Technical Colleges

This college, the teachers here, and the programs provided – are all part of an economic engine for our community.

We are proud of what students are accomplishing on our St. Petersburg and Clearwater campuses.

Collectively, these colleges generate a \$48 million impact on our community each year. This is based on the starting salaries for graduates and the estimated value to our economy from incumbent workers coming to us to improve their job skills.

### Little Money + Time = Big Payoff

- **Computer Programming** – instructional cost \$4,200 + 11 mos = **Entry-level annual wage of \$79,600**
- **HVAC Technician** – instructional cost \$4,757 + 8 mos = **Average annual income of \$40,750**
- **Electrician** – instructional cost \$5,294 + 12 mos = **Average annual income of \$41,690**

When you think about that, you see how our technical colleges are the best economic engine we have for the local economy.

- A student in our **Welding program** graduated and went to work for Toledo Scales at \$16.00 per hour, within four months she was promoted and is now **making \$28.00 per hour**
- A student in our **Plumbing program** graduated and now works for Basil Plumbing and is making \$17.00 per hour, this student can expect to be **making \$30,000 –\$35,000 in the next year**
- It is common for students in the **HVAC program** to earn an entry level wage of \$15.00 per hour but several have recently reported back that they were **making more than \$40,000 after just one year**

We have students arriving with associates, bachelors and graduate degrees – even some students with PhDs. They're looking to create a new career path or advance one they're already on.

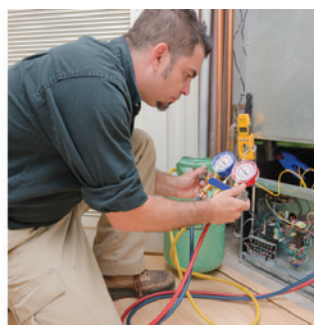
