SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS

The role of the School Resource Deputy is to maintain a safe and secure learning environment for all students and staff members.

We realize the trust you place in us to ensure our campus is a secure place for learning. In addition to our two full-time deputies, there are other ongoing safety measures that we have in place:

- Secured gates and fences with a single point of entry.
- Locked classroom doors during all instructional times.
- A visitor management system used to check-in all visitors.
- A full review of our campus security plan and full physical assessment by school staff and local law enforcement.
- Monthly safety drills and yearly training for all staff on safety protocols and prevention methods.

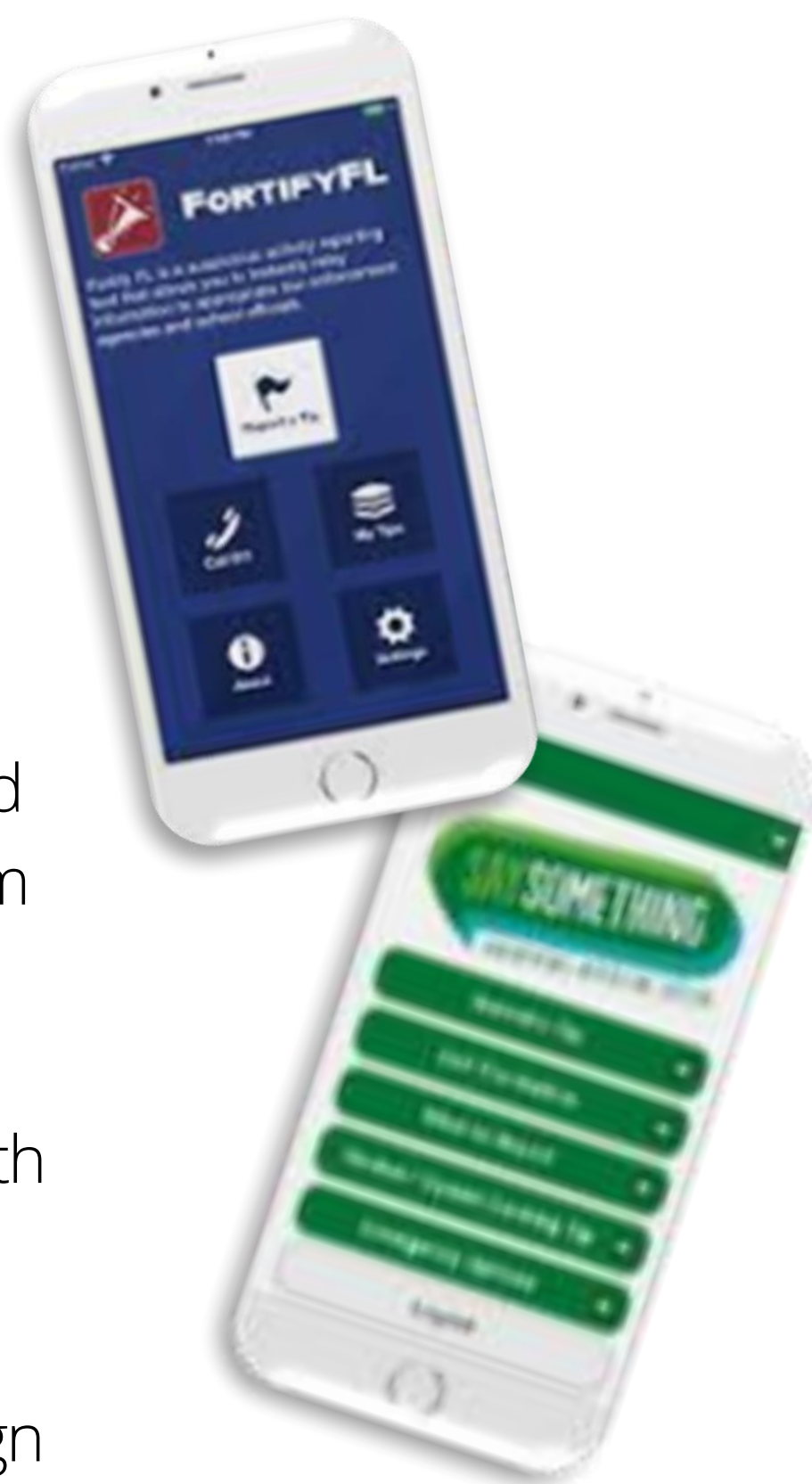


CAMPUS SAFETY

ANONYMOUS REPORTING AND SECURITY MEASURES

We use two anonymous reporting systems to allow students, staff or anyone from the community to report a concern. FortifyFL and The Say Something Anonymous Reporting System, are both school-related suspicious activity reporting tools that allow students and the community to instantly relay information anonymously. The anonymous tips are then sent to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.

All school volunteers must apply and be screened prior to volunteering on campus or with students. Level 1 volunteers receive a national background screening, and level 2 volunteers receive a fingerprint screening processed through the Federal Bureau of Investigation and Florida Department of Law Enforcement. Volunteers are required to sign in at the front office and always wear a volunteer name tag or badge while on campus or at a school sponsored event.

FACTS AND DETAILS ABOUT OUR SCHOOL AND DISTRICT

- The Pinellas County School district is the 7th largest district in the nation, with more than 101,000 students
- East Lake High School was built in 1986, and just graduated its' 36th class (class of 2024)
- East Lake has been ranked as an "A" school 11 times in the past 13 years
- Our 2024-2025 enrollment is approximately 2100 students
- We have approximately 160 staff members
- Enrollment for the class of 2025 is approximately 550 students



AWARDS AND RANKINGS

IN THE 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR....

- East Lake High School received the designation of School of Excellence by the Florida Department of Education.
- Our students took over **1800** AP tests, with over **900** students taking at least one and a **69%** pass rate
- **20** of our graduates earned their Associates of Arts college degree from SPC along with their high school diploma.
- **350** students graduated with the Pinellas County Schools Advanced Scholars designation.
- **188** students graduated Summa Cum Laude – with a GPA greater than a 3.8.
- Our seniors earned **600** industry certifications in areas such as Microsoft Bundle, Adobe InDesign, Adobe Illustrator, Adobe Flash, MTA Networking Security, Networking Fundamentals, Biotech certification, and Engineering Core Certification.
- Our senior class contributed over **25,000** documented volunteer hours serving our community.

ACADEMIC OPTIONS AVAILABLE AT EAST LAKE HS

- Core courses of Language Arts, Math, Science, and Social Studies are aligned to the Florida Standards
- World Languages include French, German, Chinese, and Spanish
- A variety of elective courses are offered in Business, Music, Art, Theater, Physical Education, Engineering, Biomedical, Social Studies, and Language Arts.
- Academies include:
 - Business Careers, Performing Arts, Biomedical Sciences, and Engineering (our district application program)



EDUCATIONAL OPTIONS

ACADEMIC OPTIONS AVAILABLE AT EAST LAKE HS

- Advanced Placement: courses include English Language, English Literature, Biology, Chemistry, Physics 1, Physics 2, Physics C: Mechanics, Environmental Science, World History, US History, US Government and Politics, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Human Geography, Psychology, European History, 2D Studio Art, 3D Studio Art, Spanish, Chinese, French, Statistics, Pre-Calculus, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Music Theory, Computer Science Principles, Computer Science A, Capstone Seminar and Research
- Dual Enrollment Program: students may earn high school and college credits by enrolling in courses at St. Petersburg College and can work toward certain vocational certifications at our local technical school, Pinellas Technical College
- Career Exploration Program: Seniors may explore career choices by enrolling in our Executive Internship Program
- AICE (Cambridge): students may take courses in Physical Education, Science, or English

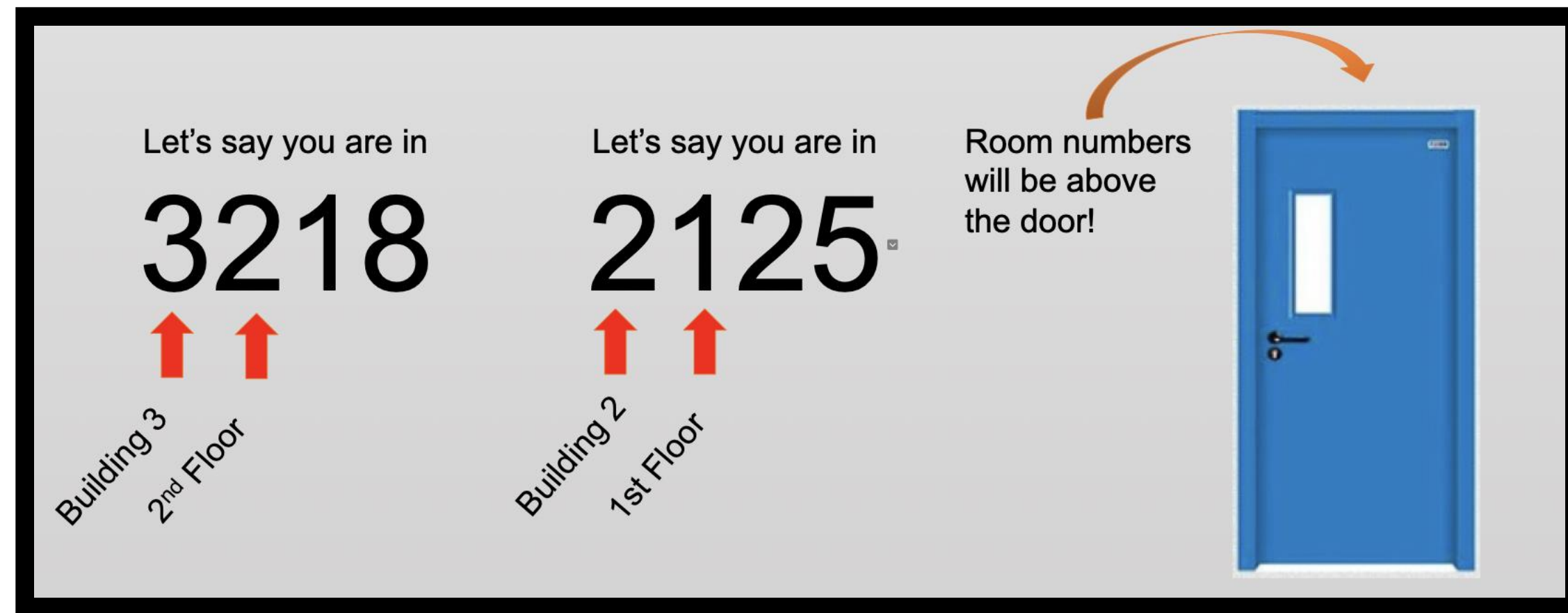


NAVIGATING CAMPUS

Working in collaboration with school counselors, the College and Career Center team provides individualized and targeted assistance to navigate the college-going process.



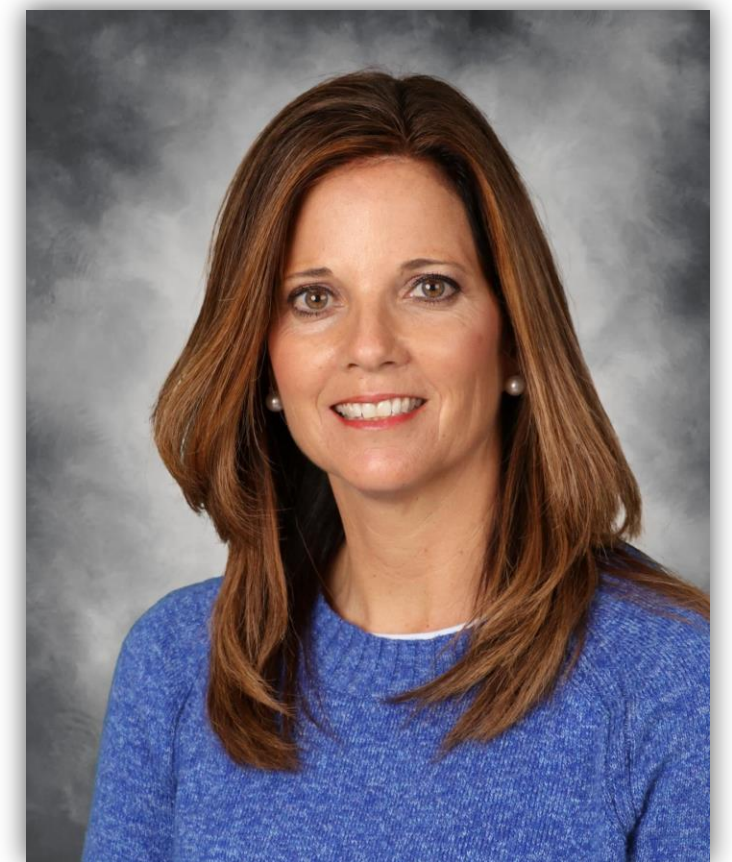
