They will promote the ideals of scholarship, responsibility, service, and leadership to contribute towards a tradition of excellence and student agency.

Eligibility & Selection

Students who excel academically and model exceptional responsibility can become members through a selection process that concludes with induction into our school's National Elementary Honor Society chapter. Membership provides an outstanding means to prepare and shape students for their middle level and high school experiences.

A faculty member serves as the NEHS Advisor. The Advisor will facilitate collaboration with faculty to determine eligibility criteria within in the first two weeks of school. Eligible students will be invited for membership and informed about the *Induction Ceremony*.

Qualifications for membership, is based on the four pillars of NEHS:

- Scholarship (Academic Performance)
- Responsibility
- Service
- Leadership

Students who meet the scholarship requirement will be extended an invitation to complete the application detailing their accomplishments and attributes.

Understanding the Obligations of Membership

Students who accept membership and are inducted into the chapter should be aware of the time and commitment involved with this honor. For example, there will be NEHS meetings. The yearly meeting schedule and member attendance obligations will be articulated with members during an orientation lead by the NEHS Advisor. Members also must participate in NEHS service projects to benefit the school and community.
