## WATER BOTTLES




In cases when a reusable water bottle is not brought to school, the school is accepting donations of water bottle cases to be used when a child does not have a refillable water bottle.

Add it to your schedule and make it fun—or be spontaneous and flexible and take it when you can.




## **Be flexible**

Items purchased through the PTA will be available for pick-up. **Go Blazers!** 






# BEAUTIFICATION EVENT

# Morning Arrival & Afternoon Dismissal ROUTE & PROCEDURES



#### **CAR CIRCLE**

Morning: [8:15-8:40]

Staff will begin supervision of students at 8:15am. Upon arrival all students will be directed to the cafeteria from 8:15am – 8:30am. For student safety, students are not permitted on campus before 8:15am. Classrooms will be open to students beginning at 8:30am. If your student is not eating breakfast, we encourage student arrivals after 8:30am. Students may report directly to their homeroom class at that time. The car circle will close at 8:40am. The instructional day will begin at 8:45am.

Afternoon: [2:55-3:15] To help support our social distancing processes, we are encouraging families of students in our lower grades (grades 1-3) to arrive promptly to the car circle at 2:55pm. We encourage families of our students in grades 4 and 5 to arrive at 3:05pm. Families of multiple students are asked to follow the encouraged schedule of their oldest child. The car line will close at 3:15pm. At that time, any remaining students will be asked to wait in the building 1 front hallway. Families will need to come to the front office to sign out their student.

#### **GENERAL ENTRANCE TO CAR CIRCLE**

The Elisa Nelson Car drop/off pick-up line will follow a one-way North to South route to keep traffic flowing. Parents are encouraged to travel south from Nebraska Avenue on 15th Street, then take a right on Virginia Avenue to enter the car circle. When exiting the car circle, please make a right turn onto 15<sup>th</sup> Street continuing South to Tampa Road.

#### Car Line Pick-Up:

- For safety reasons, there should be no cell-phone usage while parents are driving through the car circle.
- Only approved parents and guardians will be allowed to pick up a child from the car line.
- At the beginning of the school year, families will be provided with a colored sheet of paper or tag. These will need to be marked with the child's name and grade. Parents and guardians must place this sheet of paper on their dashboards every day when picking up their child from the car circle.
- One staff member will be on the radio to read the last name shown in the dashboard and will communicate this to the staff member on the microphone/waiting posts. That child will then be called and told which line to go to (there are five lines).

# Morning Arrival & Afternoon Dismissal ROUTE & PROCEDURES

- Students can expect to hear their grade level, last name, and line number when called on the microphone.
- Students should be listening for their names and waiting quietly in their grade level's area with their teachers.
- Line One begins at the end of the breezeway closest to 15th Street.
- As parents drive closer to the student area, a staff member will hold up several fingers telling each car their child's line number. Please pull up and stop at this line number.
- If a parent stops at the appropriate line number, but their child is not there, a staff member will ask that car to pull up to the silver fence beyond the breezeway. This helps traffic continue flowing while waiting for the child.
- Once a car pulls up to the proper line, staff member will walk the child to the car. Families will need to assist children into vehicles.
   Staff members will not be in direct contact with cars. The cars need to remain parked until the staff member is back on the sidewalk.
- Upon receiving their child, parents and guardians are expected to wait in the car line until the traffic begins instead of pulling out and going around the other cars. This is for everyone's safety.

#### **BUS RIDERS**

- Students who ride the bus will be expected to follow all Pinellas County School District Transportation Guidelines. All transportation questions regarding pick up/drop off locations and times will need to be addressed with the District Transportation Office.
- All busses assigned to Elisa Nelson will be color coded. At the beginning of the year, students will receive a color tag which matches their assigned bus. Teachers will attach these tags to student backpacks.
- Morning arrival Students will exit the bus and be escorted to the nearest gate to enter the school campus. Students will be directed to breakfast if needed or their homeroom class. Late bus arrivals will be directed to breakfast if needed and then class.
- The driveway in front of the school is reserved for buses from 8:00 a.m. to 8:45 a.m. and 2:30 to 3:00 p.m. each school day.
- Parents must notify the office if their student will be picked up by anyone other than the parent. If you carpool, please notify the office in writing of any changes.

#### **Afternoon Dismissal Process**

- Students will walk with a teacher to the bus dismissal location. For the safety of all students, it is expected that students follow directions, maintain a minimal noise level, and follow social distancing practices.
- As busses will be color coded, students will be required to check in with a designated teacher at their bus color station. The teacher will verify the student's name on the bus roster and mark them present. Once checked in for their specific bus, students will line up quietly and wait for all students to be counted.
- As busses arrive, the teacher will walk the students through the gates. Students will walk in single file line and will be checked a second time as they enter the bus. Upon boarding the bus, students will follow the directions of their bus driver.
- In the case of a late bus, students will sit in the shade and will be encouraged to read quietly. Cell phones are not permitted. Students may also begin to work on any homework they may have.
- If a late bus has not arrived by 3:15, all students will be walked to the main office where they can call their parents to advise or determine alternative options.

#### WALKERS/R'CLUB/VANS

- Students will walk with a teacher to the bus dismissal location. For the safety of all students, it is expected that students follow directions, maintain a minimal noise level, and follow social distancing practices.
- Walkers/bike riders will exit campus at the front of the school. Students must walk their bike while on campus.
- Walkers/Bike Riders will exit campus using the crosswalk at the north side of the school entrance.
- Students who depart through Van services will load vehicles in the staff parking area.
- R'Club students will report directly to the cafeteria.

# How to Safely Wear and Take Off a Cloth Face Covering

## **WEAR YOUR FACE COVERING CORRECTLY**

- Wash your hands before putting on your face covering
- Put it over your nose and mouth and secure it under your chin
- Try to fit it snugly against the sides of your face
- · Make sure you can breathe easily
- Do not place a mask on a child younger than 2







## **USE THE FACE COVERING TO HELP PROTECT OTHERS**

- Wear a face covering to help protect others in case you're infected but don't have symptoms
- Keep the covering on your face the entire time you're in public
- Don't put the covering around your neck or up on your forehead
- Don't touch the face covering, and, if you do, clean your hands

## **FOLLOW EVERYDAY HEALTH HABITS**

- · Stay at least 6 feet away from others
- Avoid contact with people who are sick
- Wash your hands often, with soap and water, for at least 20 seconds each time
- Use hand sanitizer if soap and water are not available





# TAKE OFF YOUR CLOTH FACE COVERING CAREFULLY, WHEN YOU'RE HOME

- Untie the strings behind your head or stretch the ear loops
- Handle only by the ear loops or ties
- Fold outside corners together
- Place covering in the washing machine
- Wash your hands with soap and water



Cloth face coverings are not surgical masks or N-95 respirators, both of which should be saved for health care workers and other medical first responders.



# HANDWASHING

For use in global low-resource settings

Wash hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds. Use the cleanest water possible, for example from an improved source.\* Use an alcohol-based hand rub that contains 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available.



Wet hands with water.




Apply enough soap to cover all hand surfaces.



Rub hands together and scrub everywhere.



Wash the front and back of your hands, in between your fingers, and under your nails.



Rinse hands with water.



Dry hands completely using a single-use towel or air dry.

# WHEN TO WASH HANDS TO PREVENT COVID-19:

- After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
- After being in a public place
- Before and after caring for someone who is sick

Remember to wash your hands after each of these activities to stay healthy:

- Before, during, and after preparing food
- Before eating food
- After changing diapers or cleaning up a child who has used the toilet
- After using the toilet or latrine
- After touching an animal, animal feed, or animal waste
- After touching garbage
