TIPS FOR IMPROVING SCHOOL TO HOME CONNECTION:

Are you having a hard time getting your child to share with you more about their day? Here are some great questions to ask beyond, "How was your day?" or "What did you do today?" that may lead to some deeper conversations.

- Tell me about the best part of your day.
- What is something kind you did for someone today?
- What was the hardest thing you had to do today?
- Did any of your classmates do anything funny?
- Tell me about what you read in class.
- Who did you play with today? What did you play?
- Do you think math [or any subject] is too easy or too hard?
- What's the biggest difference between this year and last year?
- What rules are different at school than our rules at home? Do you think they're fair?
- Who did you sit with at lunch?
- Can you show me something you learned (or did) today?
- What is something you did today that made you feel proud?

MAKERSPACE

Makerspace lessons are in full swing. Makerspace centers are teacher led in the Hub and align with content and STEM standards. This series includes: Lego wall challenge cards using area and perimeter, ocean engineering building challenge, reading informational text and creating unique habitats, Keva building block challenges, and independent reading/book checkout.

LIBRARY LESSONS

Library lesson occur on a monthly basis. Topics/activities include:

- <u>1st Grade</u> Read a loud "Creepy Pair of underwear" by Aaron Reynolds with a focus on retelling and elements of a story.
- <u>2nd Grade</u> Read a loud "Creepy Carrots" by Aaron Reynolds with a focus on problem solving and perspective.
- <u>3rd Grade</u> Introduction to the critical thinking skill "The Six Thinking Hats" focusing on informational text about oceans and perspective.
- 4th Grade Focus on informational text features using Breakout Edu digital.
- <u>5th Grade</u> Understanding and utilizing credible reference research resources/materials


