Graduation Requirements



- Complete core academic credits for standard high school diploma
- Cumulative <u>unweighted</u> GPA of 2.00
- ▶ Pass 10th grade FSA Reading Assessment
 - OR concordant score through SAT or ACT
- Pass Algebra 1 EOC
 - ▶ OR concordant score through PSAT, SAT, ACT
- Participate in End of Course Exams: Biology, Geometry, and US History



Subject Area	Credits	Specific Requirements
English	4	English I, II, III, IV
Math	4	Required: Algebra 1 and Geometry 2 additional math credits
Science	3	Required: Biology 2 additional equally rigorous science courses
Social Studies	3	Required: World History, US History, US Government (1/2 credit), and Economics with Financial Literacy (1/2 credit)
PE	1	Required: HOPE
Fine Arts	1	Performing Arts, Practical Arts, Career and Technical Education courses
Elective(s)	8	
Online	1	1 completed course

Preparing for life after high school...

▶ What?

- ► At St. Petersburg High School we are proud of our legacy of academic excellence for all. Green Devil students academically challenge themselves to prepare for many options post-graduation
- ► Mhàs
 - So students are marketable as they enter the next phase in life (after high school)

► Hows

Prior to graduation each student will earn credit in at least one Dual Enrollment course, pass one AP exam, and/or earn an industry certification

Types of courses students can take:

- ► HONORS/PRE-AP COURSES: the level of rigor in these courses pushes students to use higher level thinking and reasoning skills and learn to make connections to the "bigger ideas/concepts." Some additional work is required (i.e. Honors Paper/Project)
- ▶ ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES: college-level classes taught in high school
 - ▶ Students can get credit on their high school transcript, as well as credit in college as long as student scores a level 3, 4, or 5 on AP Exam (*credit is subject to each individual college/university).
- **DUAL ENROLLMENT COURSES**: a part-time program where students can attend college courses at SPC and/or their high school to earn credits toward fulfilling high school graduation requirements, while also earning credit toward a college degree.



^{*}Honors courses award students 0.5 quality points. AP and Dual Enrollment courses award students 1.0 quality point towards high school GPA calculation*
