We are so incredibly proud of Obed for all his hard work and perseverance to make his dream of obtaining his high school diploma a reality. Obed started at Clearview about a year ago. He had several APEX courses to complete, a couple of EOCs to pass, and one daunting ACT Reading Test to conquer. We know at times Obed felt like it would take him forever to "cross the finish line" as he was working with his father in Miami and often out of town for several days at a time, but we constantly encouraged him to stay focused and come to class whenever he found the time. Obed did just that. Slowly, but surely, he chipped away at his list of courses he needed to complete and once he was nearly finished with APEX, he began prepping for the ACT. It was just this past semester that Obed seemed to develop a drive and determination to earn his diploma; he even made a pact with me and Ms. Jet that he wouldn't go to work in Miami until we felt he was ready for the ACT in October.

He was coming in 2-3 times a week to take and review practice tests, and to finish up the last course for APEX. It was just one week before the ACT, and while he was passing his ACT practice test with flying colors, we asked Obed to promise us that the final week he would stay in town and stay focused on his studies. He agreed and his dedication to everything we asked him to do paid off. Obed finished his last APEX course, completed his two required EOCs, and dominated the ACT by earning a reading score of 22 (19 was needed to pass). Each year our ESOL team gets together to plan the annual ESOL Holiday Get Together. The ESOL students bring in food from their country and tell about it at the party.
