# PBIS: The Panther Stop & Shop

At Ponce, we strive to create caring, safe, and comfortable learning environments for all children at our school. We focus on creating relationships with our scholars and to understand their backgrounds and how these can affect some of their behaviors in school. We ensure our students feel safe with us and are excited and eager to come to school each day.

This school year we were able to bring back our school store, *The Panther Stop & Shop*. Students are able to spend their Panther Paws that they have earned by following our school PRIDE guidelines for success. **The acronym PRIDE stands for (Participate Safely, Restore Relationships, Interact with Respect, Do your Best, & Enjoy Everyone's Success).** There will be two carts for our scholars to shop at beginning Wednesday, September 1<sup>st</sup>. Scholars in grades K-2 will visit the cart in the courtyard weekly, Tuesdays- Fridays 8:15-8:40. Scholars in grades 3-5 will visit the cart on the PE covered court the same days/times.

I also wanted to introduce new forms to add to our Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS) school-wide plan. We are excited to send home Positive Referrals as often as possible and these are sent home in addition to our weekly **Proud Panther awards**.

We realize there may be times when we may have to reteach students appropriate and acceptable school behavior. We will be implementing Thinking Sheets, which will be utilized to help your child reflect on misbehavior and establish a positive plan for correcting their behavior. Our older students will write about how their behavior affected others. This is our way of helping our students determine appropriate behavior characteristics, while giving them coping skills and strategies to prevent future misbehavior.

Additionally, our school will be utilizing Level 2, and 3 behavior tracking forms. These forms will be used to match the type of behavior that is being displayed. If your child receives a misbehavior form, these are expected to be signed and returned to school. These discipline forms will help guide a conversation at home to determine why this behavior occurred in school and give to your child and their teacher the support and assistance needed to prevent it from occurring again.

- Level 2 This level of misbehavior is handled within the classroom; however, a member of administration/designee will meet with the student to discuss the behavior and work toward a resolution. Examples include excessive classroom disruption, mild threats, mild physical contact, ongoing defiance, or an inappropriate verbal exchange.
- Level 3 This level of misbehavior requires intervention from the Student Services Team/Administrator. This misbehavior could result in a referral and will result in a phone call home from a member of the behavior team. Examples include physical aggression, leaving the classroom, theft, having illegal contraband, weapons, property destruction, or severe verbal aggression with intent to harm.

We want to thank you for your support this school year as we work together to ensure our students are gaining the best social skills possible!



## **Curriculum & Assessment Updates:**

If you have a student in VPK or Kindergarten, they have likely started taking their first assessments of the school year. It's important for teachers to see where scholars are at academically so that they can better plan and differentiate instruction as needed for each student.

Teachers in grades K-5 may be reaching out you soon for conferences and to discuss PMPs (Progress Monitoring Plans) for any student in need of remediation. A PMP is an active working document that should reflect any intervention a scholar is receiving to help remediate any academic or behavioral deficiency. Don't worry if you do not hear from your child's teacher at this time. Our MAP testing begins for students in 1<sup>st</sup>- 5<sup>th</sup> grades September 1-24. If you do not hear from your child's teacher regarding a conference at this time, please expect to hear from them in October after the first cycle of assessments are completed.

#### **Cortez's Counseling Corner**

You can help prevent bullying! Research shows that bullying incidents can be decreased with intervention. By recognizing the warning signs and taking action, you can help prevent bullying. If your child has experienced bullying behavior there are actions you can take to report it. Ponce de Leon Elementary School is a BULLY FREE ZONE. Every effort will be made to provide a safe learning environment for all staff and students. Incidents of student bullying will be addressed by staff members immediately. Instances of bullying can be reported to bullying.pcsb.org. This website will direct you to the Say Something Anonymous Reporting Site where you can submit a bullying tip. In addition, we have added a BULLY REPORT BOX that is located in the media center. Students will be able to anonymously report a bullying situation by filling out a slip and putting it into the box. Our school counselor will check the box daily.
