Our Community

Gibbs High school is one of the oldest schools in Pinellas County located in St. Petersburg, Florida with a current enrollment of approximately 1,174 students in grades 9-12. As a Title I urban school, Gibbs High School draws from a population that is economically, racially and ethnically diverse. The student body is: 57.8% Black; 28.1% Caucasian; 8.7% Hispanic; 1.9% Asian; 3.4% Multiracial; and 0.1% Native American. Of the total student population, 66.2% receive free and reduced Lunch. Gibbs is home to two well-respected magnet programs, the Pinellas County Center for the Arts (PCCA) and the Business, Economics, Technology Academy (BETA). Our traditional scholars benefit from a Classroom to Career Pathways to Graduation in partnership with neighboring Pinellas Technical College and Saint Petersburg College (SPC) as well as Florida A & M University's (FAMU) School of Business and Industry (SBI). Gibbs High School is SACS accredited.
