Students sample 'Taste the World' menu options

As part of Pinellas County Schools' scratch kitchen initiative, students participated in taste tests of new globally inspired recipes prepared by the district's Food and Nutrition team. Each recipe was created using fresh ingredients — part of a broader effort to provide more nutrient-dense meals that support both student wellness and academic success.

Last month, the Food and Nutrition team visited four schools — Northeast High, Dunedin High, Walsingham Oaks K-8, and Morgan Fitzgerald Middle — to offer students of all ages the opportunity to taste and rate potential menu options. This year's National School Lunch Week theme was "Taste the World."

Hundreds of students participated, providing not only votes but also valuable verbal feedback. Their input will help shape what new menu items appear in cafeterias next year.

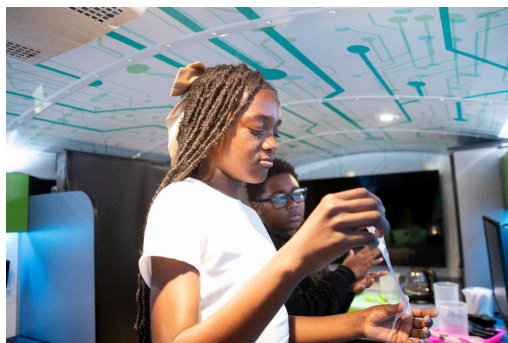

Pinellas County Schools Unveils Mobile Innovation Lab to Inspire Middle School Scientists

Pinellas County Schools officially rolled out its new Innovation Lab last month — a state-of-the-art, mobile learning space designed to bring hands-on STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) experiences directly to students throughout the district.

The former school bus has been transformed into a high-tech laboratory where seventh graders can explore robotics, physics, engineering, and ecology through immersive, interactive stations. The on-campus “field trip” model allows students to dive into activities such as navigating obstacle courses with robots, designing thermoplastic keychains, and studying Everglades ecosystems — all without leaving school grounds.
