At 75 years old, Eddie Horne finally graduated high school at the district's Countywide Graduation ceremony Aug. 21.

With his pastor and church family erupting into cheers as he crossed the stage, Eddie Horne – acknowledging the outpouring with a subtle smile and wave – graduated with his high school diploma at the age of 75.

As the oldest member of the 2025 graduating class at Countywide graduation last month, Horne said putting on his cap and gown was a dream almost 60 years in the making. At 14, Horne and his two brothers were sent to the Dozier School for Boys, a "reform" school known for its excruciating abuse and neglect, which significantly derailed his education.

"They didn't teach you nothing," Horne said, while donning a bright blue cap and gown. "That's why I lost out a lot on my education because they didn't teach you nothing. You just sat there all day and looked at books."

The first time Jordan Giorgio was on the sidelines of a football game in any official capacity, she spent most of her time delivering coffee to the ESPN Monday Night Football crew.

It was a Chicago Bears home game in 2016, and she had spent her babysitting money to purchase a plane ticket from Florida to cover the game as a production runner.

She was 20 years old at the time and still calls it one of the best decisions she's ever made.

"It was the best job," said Giorgio, a 2013 graduate of Palm Harbor University High School and now a sideline reporter for college football for CBS Sports. "I invested in myself and was just trying to meet as many people as I could networking. It led me to where I am today."

Congratulations PHU alum Mitch Farris

Congratulations to Palm Harbor University alum Mitch Farris on his call-up to the Majors! The left-handed pitcher made his debut Tuesday night, starting for the Los Angeles Angels against the Kansas City Royals. Farris threw five innings, allowing just one run on three hits and two walks over 70 pitches and received the win. Mitch makes history as the first Palm Harbor University graduate to reach the Major Leagues. Farris was selected in the 14th round by the Atlanta Braves in the summer of 2023. He was the 429th overall pick in the draft. He was traded from the Braves to the Angels in December of 2024. He graduated from Palm Harbor in 2019.
