HOW TO GET FINANCIAL AID?

- 1. Apply for admission to your future school. You can't get money if you don't attend that college.
- 2. Fill out the FAFSA in Dec., which is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. This is a must! Create your FAFSA ID at:

StudentAid.gov and get it on-line at www.fafsa.gov.

3. Wait for a "package." This is a financial award package from one or more of the colleges/ universities to which you applied. The \$ amount they offer you is based on your FAFSA information. Each school may offer different types of aid through CSS/Profile,

4. Pick your package. Once you have decided on an offer, send your materials to the financial aid office at your college/university.
