Hello Belleair Families.

Spring has arrived! As we welcome March, we are getting closer to our final guarter for the 19/20 school year. Spring break is just around the corner and school will be closed from March 16th – March 23rd. School will reopen on Tuesday March 24th. The testing cycle for the 19/20 school year will begin March 30th. Our third graders will show what they know on the Florida Standards Assessment Test in Reading. Students will test for two days. Our fourth and fifth graders will take the Florida Standards Writing Assessment for 1 day. We will send

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more information as we get closer to this testing period.

Report a Safety Concern



Pinellas County Schools has partnered with Sandy Hook Promise to offer the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. Say Something allows you to submit secure & anonymous safety concerns to help identify and intervene upon at-risk individuals BE-FORE they hurt themselves or others. Tips made to the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System are passed along to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.

Additionally, the district utilizes FortifyFL, a school-related suspicious activity reporting tool that allows Florida students and the community the ability to instantly relay information anonymously concerning unsafe, potentially harmful, dangerous, violent or criminal activities, or the threat of these activities, to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act. Visit the FortifyFL website
