Report a Safety Concern



Pinellas County Schools has partnered with Sandy Hook Promise to offer the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. Say Something allows you to submit secure & anonymous safety concerns to help—identify and intervene upon at-risk individuals BEFORE they hurt themselves or others. Tips made to the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System are passed along to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.

Additionally, the district utilizes FortifyFL, a school-related suspicious activity reporting tool that allows Florida students and the community the ability to instantly relay information anonymously concerning unsafe, potentially harmful, dangerous, violent or criminal activities, or the threat of these activities, to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act.

Homework Hotline Information



Pinellas County Schools Homework Helpline, (727)547-7223, offers free homework help for students in grades 1-12. The Homework Helpline is staffed by teachers certified in math, science, language arts and social studies. Help is available from 5 to 8 p.m., Monday through Thursday, on all school days, except when there is no school the following day.



Kindergarten through fifth grade students at Belleair elementary school are eligible to check out a laptop for home use. These laptops are offered to you at no cost by the PCS Title 1 department to provide equal access to technology, promote student success, and to extend learning outside of the classroom.

Students can access online educational resources through CLEVER that

help improve skills in reading, math, science, and social studies, such as <u>iStation</u>, <u>DreamBox</u>, <u>myON</u>, <u>i-</u>Ready, Sora, and so much more!

Process:

Parent/Guardian must complete C4S paperwork

Paperwork can be found on our school website or obtained from Ms. Crosley, Library Media Specialist

Parent/Guardian must provide a **government ID** (driver's license, state ID, military ID, or passport) to be **copied** when they turn-in completed paperwork

Student will be called down to get their computer by Ms. Crosley and she will make sure that they can log-in and connect to WIFI.

NOTE: WIFI is not provided by PCS. You can connect to your home WIFI or use the FREE WIFI provided at most restaurants, and public places.

Student MUST return the laptop when requested (in Jaunary, and May) for updates and servicing. The laptop will be returned to the student to bring back home within 1 week (provided that there are no major issues)

Students can keep their laptops over the summer, as well, provided they return them for their May servicing

Spectrum Internet TM Assist

Low-income families and seniors can get unlimited high-speed internet for just \$14.99 per month

Through the Spectrum Internet Assist program, qualified households can receive:

- High-speed 30 Mbps Internet with no data caps
- Internet modem included
- No contracts required

Add in-home WiFi for \$5 more per month

Offer not valid for current Spectrum Internet subscribers or had a Spectrum Internet subscription within the last 6 months.

NOTE: The \$14.99 offer gives wired service and offers a wi-fi router for \$5 per month. You can purchase your own wi-fi router either from Amazon.com or RadioShack or any other electronics retailer. They are easy to set up and it will save you \$5 per month.

To qualify for Spectrum Internet Assist, a member of the household must be a recipient of one of the following programs:

- The National School Lunch Program (NSLP); free or reduced cost lunch
- Seniors 65 and older who receive Supplemental Security Income

Programs that do not qualify for Spectrum Internet Assist: Social Security Disability (SSD), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), and Social Security Retirement and Survivor Benefits are different from Supplemental Security Income and do NOT meet eligibility requirements.

Important: Spectrum Internet Assist program is not for String, Smart TV.
