- Since 2004, the Pinellas County Schools
 Referendum has supported the recruitment and
 retention of quality teachers; strengthened
 reading, music and art programs; and provided
 up-to-date technology.
- Pinellas County voters have overwhelmingly supported renewals of the tax since 2004.
- An independent committee (ICROC) oversees the distribution of funds to ensure that money is spent as voters intended.



The Referendum has supported teacher salaries since 2004, impacting nearly 100,000 students each year.



Each year, thousands of students participate in Referendum-funded field trips to museums and art centers.
