SENIOR EXPENSES

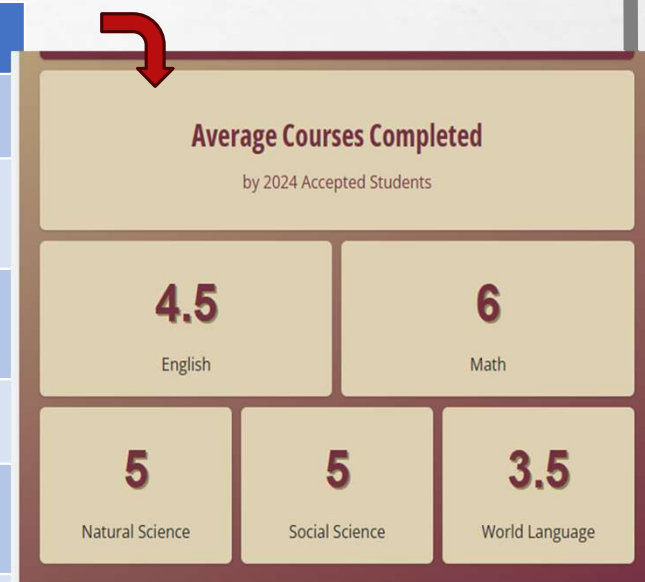
- Senior pictures from Cady Photography ---- \$15-200 depending on package

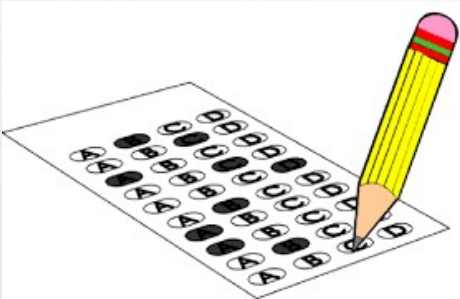

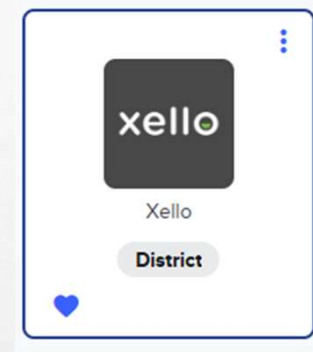
