
A Message from Mr. Pleshe

It's time to update your information!


If you have a new student starting school next year, here are the things that need to be done.

Parent Portal – make or update information

Make a reservation for your zone school (if you would like to go to a school outside of your zone.

Things that you will need for registration:

- Birth Certificate
- Physical within the last year
- Updated Immunization records
- 2 proofs of address electric bill, water bill, lease agreement, mortgage bill, homeowner insurance
- Any court documents that relate to the child
- Any other school records that may be helpful for your student
- FOR VPK: we must have the VPK voucher to register your child. You can go to Elcpinellas.org to get your voucher

How would you like to help save the environment and raise money for our school at the same time?

Sexton Elementary School recently partnered with Clothes Bin, a national recycling program to help keep unwanted clothes and shoes out of landfills. Many of you have already seen the green Clothes Bin located in the front car circle.

The best part is that the school earns money for every pound collected in our bins. So, not only are we helping the environment, but we're earning extra money for school programs.

Clothes Bin accepts less than perfect textiles. Worn, torn and stained materials are okay. The company can repurpose, resell and recycle 100% of all collections from the bin program. For example, shoes that are no longer able to be resold are ground up for playground material, and clothing with holes/stains are converted to wiper rags and home insulation.

"More than 85% of textile waste ends up in landfills every year. That's 22 billion pounds," says Chris Wolfe, owner of the local Clothes Bin operation. "By simply recycling these materials, you can help reduce greenhouse gas emissions, which are very harmful to our environment."

Clothes Bin can accept a variety of materials, including:

Blankets Sandals

Boots Shoes

Coats Skirts

Comforters Socks

Dresses Sweaters

Hats Sweatshirts

Jeans Suits

Kids clothing Ties

Linens Towels

Purses Undergarments

Rags



We encourage everyone to take advantage of this great program. So, before you throw out those old shoes or jeans, please consider bagging them up and bringing them to our Clothes Bins here at Sexton!
