


As of January 1, 2022, the Pinellas County School Board approved a partnership with Pinellas Suncoast Transit Authority (PSTA) to provide FREE PSTA bus rides to all students. The

opportunity is provided by the <u>Universal Pass</u> or <u>UPASS</u>, an agreement between the school district and the PSTA.

PCS students can ride free, any time (including after school hours and weekends), and on all routes so they can access not only school campuses but jobs, after-school activities, or even the beach just by showing their student ID to the PSTA driver. Please keep this resource in mind if transportation issues are impacting your child's attendance.

Clothes To Kids is a nonprofit organization with three stores located in Pinellas and Hillsborough Counties where kids in crises or eligible for free or reduced priced lunch can shop for a week's worth of school clothes — free of charge. The selections at our stores area combination of new and quality-used clothing (underwear and socks are always new).

Each shopper receives a wardrobe which includes:

5 pairs of new underwear, 5 pairs of new socks, 5 tops, 4 bottoms (including uniforms), 1 dress (optional), 1 pair of shoes and a jacket (in season)

There are two ways PreK4-12th grade kids receive a wardrobe:

- 2. Clothes To Go. Visit: https://clothestokids.org/. Complete a Clothes To Go form and request a wardrobe curbside.

Complete the form as instructed for all students in the family (PreK4-12th grade)

When form is completed, click submit.
