IMPORTANT MESSAGE

On July 1, 2025, Florida House Bill 1105, including new provisions regarding student use of cell phones and other wireless communication devices in schools, became law. 
Elementary & Middle Schools

It's time to update your information!


If you have a new student starting school next year, here are the things that need to be done.

Parent Portal – make or update information

Make a reservation for your zone school (if you would like to go to a school outside of your zone.

Things that you will need for registration:

- Birth Certificate
- Physical within the last year
- Updated Immunization records
- 2 proofs of address electric bill, water bill, lease agreement, mortgage bill, homeowner insurance
- Any court documents that relate to the child
- Any other school records that may be helpful for your student
- FOR VPK: we must have the VPK voucher to register your child. You can go to Elcpinellas.org to get your voucher



PBIS Points

(Positive Behavior Intervention System)

PBIS is our main connection with parents, if you haven't signed up yet for the APP, please get a paper from the front office. PBIS REWARDS Family App (it is purple). Each child in your family has their own QR code that you will use to see their behavior progress in school. The students earn 5 points a day: 2 for behavior in class, 1 for behavior in Specials (music, art, and PE), 1 for behavior in lunch, and 1 for being in uniform Monday-Friday (unless they had enough points for RAYS Day. Attached to the PBIS Family Letter is a Sexton brochure explaining all the activities we do throughout the school year and what the students at Sexton can receive points for. They can use these points how they choose: in the school store, classroom store, RAYS DAY, or the special parties we have planned.

October is Physical Therapy Month – Celebrating Movement and Wellness in Our Schools


