# **Class Lists**

Class lists will be posted on the front office windows on August 8th at 4:00pm. Parents may also find this information in FOCUS. If you are not able to access Focus, please call the school for support or visit the media center during the Back-to-School Open House. **All student forms are now digital in Focus.** We ask that parents fill out all necessary forms on Focus prior to the start of the school year.

# **Arrival and Dismissal**

We are excited to welcome both our returning and new Pioneers to Garrison-Jones. If you are a returning Pioneer family, you know that



dismissal time is a very busy time of the day. We have more than 600 students leaving as walkers, bike riders, bus riders or the car line daily. In order to ensure staff, student and family safety during this busy time, we ask that you read through this information and practice these guidelines

beginning the first day of school. Please be patient during the first couple weeks of school and give one another grace during dismissal.

### Car Line, Bus, and After-School Program Dismissal

- The North/Pink Car Circle is for students in PreK, Kindergarten, 5th grade and any student who has a sibling in those grades
- The South/Green Car Circle is for students in 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th grade
- The Bus Circle is for bus riders and any van or off-campus program riders (students attending after-school care off campus, I.e. Lee's Taekwondo)

### **Car Line Dismissal Safety Procedures & Expectations**

- All vehicles must have a Garrison-Jones Dismissal Tag when picking up students. If you need an extra tag for a family member, please let your child's teacher know. This year, if you do not have a tag, we will ask you to park and come to the office with your ID to get a tag.
- Parents may not exit the vehicle during arrival/drop-off.
- If you need to exit the vehicle to put your child in a car seat, please park in the parking lot.
- Students should enter the car on the passenger side, so they are not walking in the line of any moving vehicles.
- Please limit cars passing one another in the car line whenever possible.
- If you are picking up a 5th grade safety patrol, please park in the lot to wait for the student or do not arrive until 3:15 when their duties are completed.

## Walkers, Golf Carts and Bikers Safety Procedures & Expectations

- Please be sure to supervise your student during dismissal. Students should be next to the parent or adult picking up the child.
- Utilize walkways and keep our campus beautiful by staying off the rocks and shells.

# First Day of School - August 12th

The first day of school is Monday, August 12th and student hours are 8:45am-2:55pm. We look forward to welcoming all new and returning Pioneers to the 2024-2025 school year! Our staff is committed to making this a highly successful school year for each student. Our plant operations crew has been working hard all summer to be sure our students return to a clean, safe campus.

## **Important Reminders**

- Please follow the city of Dunedin traffic/road signs while entering and exiting the campus.
- The bus loop is for buses only. No cars may enter/exit the bus loop during arrival and dismissal times.
- Students arriving late to school must be escorted to the office by an adult and signed in.
- Early dismissal is discouraged, when possible, but if you must, please do so prior to 2:15.
- Families of bus riders should sign up for a Bus Bulletin to receive alerts of delays or other updates.
- It is the responsibility of the parents/caregivers to report their child's absence, along with the reason for the absence by calling the school, emailing the teacher or entering the absence on the school website. Parents will receive a magnet at Back to School Open House on August 9th with a QR code to report student absences.

· Parents may walk their child to class, if they chose, on the first day of school only. VPK and Kinder students may also be walked to class on August 13th.

## **Attendance Matters - Every Day Counts!**



### Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- · Starting in preschool and kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school
- Missing 10%, or about 2 days each month over the course of a school year, can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just one or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- · Absences and tardiness can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school-and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Eventually good attendance will be a skill that will help them succeed in high school and college.

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO

- · Set a regular bedtime and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before. Keep your child healthy and make sure your child has the required
- shots. · Introduce your children to their teachers and classmates before
- school starts. · Develop backup plans for getting to school if something comes up.
- Call on a family member, a neighbor or another parent. Try to schedule non-urgent related medical appointments and
- extended trips when school isn't in session.
- · If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors and other parents for advice on how to make your child feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- · If you are concerned that your child may have Covid-19, call your school for advice.
- · If your child must stay home due to illness, ask the teacher for resources and ideas to continue learning at home.

#### ¿SABÍA USTED?

- · A partir de preescolar y kínder, demasiadas ausencias pueden hacer que los niños se retrasen en la escuela. Faltar un 10%, o aproximadamente 2 días al mes durante el transcurso de un año escolar, puede dificultar el
- aprendizaje de la lectura. Los estudiantes aún pueden guedarse atrás si faltan solo uno o dos días cada pocas semanas.
- · Llegar tarde a la escuela puede provocar una baja asistencia escolar.
- · Las ausencias y tardanzas pueden afectar a toda el aula si el docente tiene que retrasar el aprendizaje para ayudar a los niños a ponerse al día.

Asistir a la escuela con regularidad ayuda a los niños a sentirse mejor con la escuela y con ellos mismos Comience a desarrollar este hábito en el preescolar para que aprendan de inmediato que es importante ir a la escuela a tiempo, todos los días. Con el tiempo, la buena asistencia escolar será una habilidad que les ayudará a tener éxito en la escuela secundaria y la universidad.

#### LO QUE PUEDE HACER

- Establezca una rutina regular para la hora de dormir y una rutina matutina.
- · Elija y disponga la ropa y empaque las mochilas la noche anterior. Mantenga a su niño saludable y asegúrese de que haya recibido las vacunas necesarias.
- · Presente a su niño a sus docentes y compañeros de clase antes de que comience la escuela.
- Desarrolle planes de contingencia para llegar a la escuela si surge
- algo. Llame a un familiar, vecino u otro padre. Trate de programar las citas médicas no relacionadas con el Covid-19 y los viajes largos para cuando no haya clases en la escuela. • Si su niño parece tener ansiedad por ir a la escuela, hable con los
- docentes, los consejeros escolares y otros padres para que le aconsejen cómo hacer que su niño se sienta cómodo y emocionado
- por el aprendizaje. Si le preocupa que su niño pueda tener Covid-19, llame a su escuela
- para que le aconsejen. Si su niño debe quedarse en casa debido a una enfermedad, pídales a los docentes recursos didácticos e ideas para seguir aprendiendo en casa.
