

# **Academic Achievements**

- For the second time, in 2017, our school was recognized as the most rigorous school in Pinellas County by the Washington Post, and indicated that we are 49th in the state, 235th in the nation.
- Our school graduation rate has increased from 73% to 89% in the past seven years.
- Approximately 75% of our graduating senior class received college credit through AICE, AP, or Dual Enrollment, or an industry certification in addition to their high school diploma.
- Last year, Cambridge AICE awarded eight of our students with the coveted of Scholar Award, two more received the Scholar Award with Merit, and one more received the Scholar Award with Distinction, which is the highest honor a student can receive from Cambridge AICE. We had more students receive these honors compared to all the other schools in the district with Cambridge AICE programs.
- Last year, Cambridge AICE awarded eight of our students with the coveted of Scholar Award, two more received the Scholar Award with Merit, and one more received the Scholar Award with Distinction, which is the highest honor a student can receive from Cambridge AICE. We had more students receive these honors compared to all the other schools in the district with Cambridge AICE programs.

## **Points of Pride**

- Three times, our school was named a Model School by The International Center for Leadership in Education (ICLE), and is the only Model School in the Tampa Bay area.
- The Career Academy of International Culture and Commerce (CAICC) was named a Model Academy by The National Career Academy Coalition (NCAC).
- Our school is the first Wall-to-Wall Academy Model High School in Pinellas County providing industry certification and internship opportunities for all of our students.
- The Class of 2018 won two athletic Conference Championships, five District Championships, and three regional quarter final championships. Our girls swim team placed sixth in the state, and our Girls Cross Country Team qualified for state. Our track team also had one athlete place 3rd and 7th in two events at state! Our Varsity Football team was undefeated two years in a row!
- Last year, Clearwater High school had five students commended in the National Merit Program, one National Hispanic Recognition Scholar, and one National Merit Semi-Finalist.
