Beverly Robinson Campbell Memorial Scholarship 2022 Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM) Scholarships 2022

- Scholarship applications must be postmarked by February 25, 2022
- Scholarship applicants must have a minimum cumulative weighted GPA of 2.5.
- Scholarship applicants must include an official transcript including 1st semester grades of their senior year.
- Scholarship applicants must complete all areas to be eligible to compete for these scholarships.

These scholarships will be awarded during the Joseph L. Carwise Minority Achievement Awards, Thursday, March 24, 2022 at the Largo Cultural Arts Center. Scholarship recipients are expected to attend this event.

The Beverly Robinson Campbell Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to three African-American female seniors who live and attend a North Pinellas County high school, a Pinellas County magnet program, ECP (Early College Program) or St. Petersburg College Collegiate High School. This scholarship will be awarded based on GPA, character references, and an essay.

> The Beverly Robinson Campbell Memorial Scholarship will be awarded to participants based on value points. Funds will be released in September 2022, upon receipt of documentation of enrollment in an accredited college or university. 1st Place - \$2,000.00

2nd Place -\$1,200.00

One Science, Technology, Engineering, Math (STEM) Scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 will be awarded to an African American male or female senior who resides in North Pinellas County and attends a North Pinellas County high school, a Pinellas County magnet program, ECP (Early College Program) or St. Petersburg College Collegiate High School. This scholarship is based upon an interest in the fields of science, technology, engineering or math, as well as, GPA, character references, and an essay.

The STEM Scholarship will be awarded to the participants with the highest number of points. Funds will be released in September 2022, upon receipt of documentation of enrollment in an accredited college, university or technical center/college. The awarded scholarship must be used by the recipients within one year from being awarded.

Criteria and Value Points

Scholastic: GPA (4 Point Scale) (Possible 32 points)

4.0 or above	(32 points)		
3.5-3.9	(25 - 29 points)

Each applicant is responsible for obtaining an **official transcript**, which should include the high school GPA through the first semester of his or her senior year.

Character References (Possible 15 points)

Applicants must obtain three character references. These letters must be from their school, place of worship, and a community leader. All three letters must be on official letterhead and include the person's name, title, telephone number and e-mail address. Beverly Robinson Campbell Memorial Scholarship reference letter must be written by the community leader who is a member of the organization who benefited from a community service project you participated in 2019 or 2020. A letter from a relative is unacceptable.

Essay Topics (Possible 28 points)

The essay should have a minimum of 350 words and a maximum of 1000 words. (Words used as articles in sentence structure will not count as part of the 350-word minimum.)
