



Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program



Awarded to every student in the state of Florida who meets all requirements.



Four levels of Scholarships

Requires that students complete the Florida Financial Aid Application

General Requirements for **Bright Futures**



Complete the FFAA no later than August 31 after high school graduation.

- Be a Florida resident and U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen as determine by the student's postsecondary institution.
- Earn a standard Florida high school diploma, or its equivalent.
- Not have been found guilty of, or pled nolo contendre to a felony charge.
- Be accepted by, and enroll in a degree or certificate program at, an eligible Florida public or independent postsecondary institution.
- Be enrolled for at least six non-remedial semester credit hours (or the equivalent in quarter or clock hour) per term.
- If not funded in the academic year immediately following high school graduation, apply within five years of high school graduation to have your award reinstated.

Florida Academic & Medallion-Coursework

Complete the required high school course work:

16 High School Course Credits

- 4- English (three must include substantial writing)
- 4- Mathematics (at or above the Algebra 1 level)
- 3- Natural Sciences (two must have substantial laboratory)
- 3- Social Studies
- 2- World Languages (sequential, same language)

Coursework aligns with the State University System (SUS) admissions requirements.






The ACT[®] composite score is the average of the best section scores across the four subject area sections from any test sitting: English, Math, Reading and Science.

The CLT[®] combined score is the sum of the best Verbal Reasoning, Grammar/Writing and Quantitative Reasoning from any test sitting of the CLT[®] for an Overall Score.

The SAT[®] combined score is the sum of the best Reading (Critical Reading or Evidence-Based Reading and Writing) and Math section scores from any test sitting of the SAT[®].

Florida Academic and Florida Medallion-College **Entrance Exams**



Students will be evaluated based on official test scores from the FDOE repository. To ensure OSFA obtains official test scores:

Ensure demographics on your test registration and high school transcript match; and

Request your official single sitting test scores be sent to one of Florida's public colleges or state universities.


The ACT[®], CLT[®], or SAT[®] exams may be taken an unlimited number of times through August 31 of the high school graduation year (or through January 31 for mid-year graduates).

Other Ways to Qualify

Students who have demonstrated academic merit through a recognition program may be eligible for Bright Futures without having to meet one or more of the requirements.

- National Merit Finalist and Scholars
- National Hispanic Scholars
- AICE Diploma
- IB Diploma

If students earn any of the above, they do not have to meet the test score requirement but do need to have the service or paid work hours.





Florida Gold Seal CAPE Scholarship (GSC) **Initial Eligibility** Requirements

1. Earn a minimum of 5 postsecondary credit hours through CAPE industry certifications that articulate for college credit. 2. Complete at least 30 volunteer service hours, 100 paid work hours, or a combination that equals a minimum of 100 total hours.



Scholarship Restrictions for Florida Gold Seal CAPE

 Until a student has earned an eligible associate degree, Gold
 Seal CAPE (GSC) scholarships may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in applied science or associate in science), or a career certificate program.

 Upon completion of an eligible associate degree program, a GSC Scholar may also receive an award for a maximum of 60 credit hours toward an eligible baccalaureate degree.

Florida Gold **Seal Vocational** Scholarship (GSV) Initial Eligibility Requirements

Achieve the required weighted 3.0 GPA in the non-elective high school courses,

Take at least 3 full credits in a single **Career and Technical Education program**,

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Achieve the required minimum 3.5 unweighted GPA in the career education courses,

Complete 30 service hours, 100 work 04 hours, or a combination that equals a minimum of 100 hours and

> Achieve the required minimum scores on one of the college entrance exams outlined on next slide

Scholarship Restrictions for Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship

GSV may only be used at postsecondary institutions that offer an applied technology diploma, technical degree education program (associate in applied science or associate in science), or a career certificate program.



Volunteer Service and Paid Work Hours

Beginning with the class of 2023, students may now use work hours in lieu of service hours

Volunteer service and work hours can now be combined Both work and service hours must be completed with an agency, company, organization or business where they can be verified Volunteer Hours: FAS 100 hours, FMS 75 hours, GSC and GSV 30 hours

Work Hours: 100 hours for all levels

Combination of Volunteer and Work: 100 hours for all levels

What Hours Cannot Be Counted?

Service Hours

- Court mandated community service.
- Service hours where a family member is verifying completed hours
- An. activity were there is no responsible adult on site to evaluate and confirm students performance.
 - Donations such as Locks of Love or giving blood.
- Participation on a sports team or performance of any kind unless participation is considered an act of service.

Work Hours

• Work hours where a family member is verifying the completed hours.



Profferfish

Profferfish is a new online system that students use to track their volunteer and work hours.


Students access it through their Clever account.



Florida Medallion

Beginning fall 2021, Florida Medallion Scholarship students enrolled in an associate degree program at a Florida College System institution will receive 100 percent of tuition and specific fees.

Upon associate degree completion, a student may use award to pursue a baccalaureate degree and receive 75 percent of tuition and specific fees.

Additional Information Regarding Bright Futures Scholarships

Renewal Requirements Students must earn the number of credit hours based on the student's enrollment type per term, and The renewal cumulative GPA requirements FAS- 3.0 **FMS, GSV, GSC-2.75** Students permitted one-time restoration opportunity during first year of funding if they don't meet the GPA requirement.

Eligible students have 5 years after high school graduation to reinstate their award but must complete FFAA by August 31st after high school graduation. Students who've completed the FFAA will be evaluated for Bright Futures in two cycles: Early Evaluation- Letters posted to student's FFAA accounts in March Final Evaluation- Letters posted to student's FFAA accounts in July

Bright Futures Evaluations

High schools will provide juniors and seniors with a printed copy of their evaluation this fall.

Check with your school to find out when you will receive it.





What is the FAFSA?

- Student Aid (FAFSA) beginning senior year to receive grants (federal & some state) student loans and federal work
- Free Application for Federal • Must complete it annually study
- Some college-base grants and scholarships
- That FAFSA is free!
- When you are ready, go to www.studentaid.gov to get started.
- Normally opens October 1st but is delayed until sometime in December.



The FAFSA Simplification Act was ratified in August 2022. The purpose of the act is to streamline the FAFSA with three main goals:

- Expand eligibility for federal financial aid,
- Reduce barriers for certain student populations,
- A better user experience when completing the FAFSA

FAFSA Changes-Process

- Old Process: Contributor could access the FAFSA without creating FSA ID
 - New Process: Contributor must create an FSA ID and have it verified before accessing the FAFSA.
- Old Process: Parent without SSN could not create FSA ID.
 - New Process: Parents without SSN will be able to create FSA ID.
- Old Process: Using the IRS data retrieval tool was optional.
 - New Process: All contributors must click a permission box allowing their financial information to be transferred from IRS, including non-tax-filers
- Old Process: If parents are divorced, parent information provided was determined by "whom the student lived with more out of the year."
 - New Process: New Definition of parents is "parent which provides the greater portion of the student's financial support."
- Old Process: Student could enter up to 10 colleges.
 - New Process: Student will be able to add up to 20 colleges.
