Bayside works with students who are behind in credits through modified scheduling and generally smaller class sizes. Bayside runs on the quarter-system, so students begin new classes every 9 weeks for a fresh start and faster credit recovery. The block schedule allows students to focus on only 4 classes during a grading period. Students can earn 4 credits every 9 weeks. All coursework is mastery-based and gives scholars the opportunity to earn credits on an individualized plan and often at an accelerated pace. Requires participation in modified dress code. Pinellas Gulf Coast Academy is an accredited Mid County educational option for students who wish to catch up or accelerate their academic requirements for graduation. Our blended instructional model consists of both online and teacher-directed instruction. Coursework is mastery based, which gives students an opportunity to complete credits at an individualized and often accelerated pace. Students who live in Clearwater, Seminole, Pinellas Park, or Largo may qualify for district bus transportation. Students who live beyond a two-mile radius from the school are eligible to receive a PSTA bus pass. Requires participation in modified dress code.
