Math is all around us and here are a few ways to work math into conversations with your Wildcat:

### Remember...Be positive about math:

- Let your child know that **everyone** can learn math.
- Let your child know that you think math is important and fun.
- Point out ways in which family members use math in their jobs or everyday lives.
- Be positive about your own math abilities. Try to avoid saying "I was never good at math" or "I never liked math".
- Encourage your child to be persistent if a problem seems difficult.
- Praise your child when he or she makes an effort, and share in the excitement when he or she solves a problem or understands something the first time.

As a reminder, we are always monitoring student absences and tardies. For elementary students, it is the parent's responsibility to make sure their student attends school and is on time. If your child has several absences and/or tardies, please contact the school so we are able to determine if these unexcused absences can be changed to excused. If there is a problem that is making it difficult to get your child to school, please contact our social worker or guidance counselor for additional help.

Thank you for allowing us to work with your child/children each day at Gulfport Elementary. Let us continue to work together to make this an amazing 2017-2018 school year.

#### March is Music in Our Schools Month

The National Association for Music Education has designated March as **Music in Our Schools Month**. Researchers have studied the benefits of music education for decades, consistently finding strong correlations between music and academic achievement. The College Entrance Board found that students in music programs scored 63 points higher on the verbal and 44 points higher on the math sections of the SATs than students with no music participation. Music not only impacts academic achievement, it also shapes the way our students understand themselves and the world around them.
