During weekly PLCs, each team will be required to contact parents. Every week they are to update that log documenting which parents they have contacted and for what purpose. This will ensure that at some point every family is being contacted by a teacher. Additionally, all staff is being paid to return to school two days early. During this time staff will have various professional development trainings that revolve around family engagement and other pertinent school information.

The feedback on the survey will be used to plan future events, i.e. the quarterly mini workshops we will present.

We will address barriers to increase attendance and academic support at home by hosting quarterly parent mini workshops. These workshops will have to bridge the gap between school and community. It will focus on families being intrical partners in their child's eduction. We will also use PBS to incentives students who show an improvement in attendance and those who have perfect attendance.

We will post messages on our marquee, send home flyers, compose emails and send robo calls. Teachers will also make personal calls to parents on a weekly basis while they are in PLCs.
