COUNSELORS' CORNER

SENIORS:

If your senior has not registered for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program, then they should do so as soon as possible. ONLY seniors who are graduating may register. The scholarship is available to students who qualify and who are going to attend a school in Florida. Please have them go to: www.floridastudentfinancialaid.org.

REMEMBER: NO APPLICATION = NO FLORIDA BRIGHT FUTURES \$ **COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS:**

Seniors must have their completed forms turned in to their school counselor by May 3rd so that the information can be recorded. Seniors who qualify and have applied for Bright Futures will be notified of their award status late July or early August for the fall semester. All other students who have completed their hours are asked to follow the same May 3rd due date.

Students who would like to start their community service hours over the summer break are asked to come to room 221 to pick up the forms. Please have those forms turned in by May 3rd for approval.

Qualifying test scores are required to receive for Florida Bright Futures. Students will need to register at either of the following websites:

Juniors should strongly consider registering and taking either or both of these tests so they are ready for the college application process at the beginning of their senior year.



CREDIT RECOVERY:

Night school is available for students 16 and older who have failed a course during the day. The student must see their counselor for the district form. Attendance will be taken and coursework is to be completed on-site so there is no assigned homework.

Saturday morning APEX is another option for students needing to recover from D's and F's. The hours are from 9am - 12pm every Saturday and there are 3 certified teachers available for APEX classes or free tutoring.

If your student is in an AP class, then they are required to take the national AP exam that they are scheduled for. Students are responsible for completing their test preparation and transportation. Students will be informed of their test date, time, and location of test. All AP exams will be administered May 6th – May 17th.

AWARDS NIGHT:

Our annual Awards Night will be Wednesday, May 1st at 6:00pm in the auditorium. Students who are receiving awards will be invited via invitation.

REGISTRATION:

Please check with your student to verify that they have submitted their course requests for next year's schedule. If a request has not been submitted, one will be made for the student.

TESTING, TESTING, TESTING:

The state of Florida has determined testing "windows" for End of Course Assessments. Students who are enrolled in: US History, Biology, Algebra 1, or Geometry will be taking an EOC. Students will be notified of the date, time, and location for each test that they are taking. It is vital that students show up on time and put forth their best effort on their exams. Parents can support their students by encouraging them and making sure that they are well rested and on time.

SPC DUAL ENROLLMENT:

Students who are doing part-time Dual Enrollment on SPHS' campus and/or at St. Petersburg College campus next year must obtain an SPC student number and a "pink card" so they can go to an off campus testing center and take the PERT. For classes at SPC, registration paperwork must be completed. Please see your counselor for more information.

SUMMER BRIDGE CLASSES

High School Summer Bridge Programs will be held from 8:30am to 12:30pm, Monday through Thursday on the dates below...

Freshmen Prep – 3 Sessions- June 11th-20th, June 24th-July 3rd, July 8th- July 18th

(This program is for current 8th-graders. It will get students ready for high school and give them a strong start their freshman year. This engaging program is centered around student interests and a project of their choice. Freshman Prep will help 9th graders get to know their high school with a fun mix of technology and art or music. Students can earn a 1/2 elective credit.

PERT Prep/Algebra 1 EOC Retake Prep - June 11th to July 18th

This program is for rising 9th, 10th, and 11th graders who have failed the spring Algebra End of Course assessment. The program provides students with prescriptive assistance and practice to close gaps in algebra skills or content knowledge. Students will earn a ½ credit in an Algebra 1 Credit Recovery (elective).

Algebra 1 Course Retake- June 11th to July 18th

This program is for students who failed Algebra 1 and need grade forgiveness in Algebra suite (Algebra 1A and 1B, Algebra 1) of classes.

ACT Prep - June 11th to July 18th

This program is for rising 11th- and 12th-graders who need to pass the 10th Grade Florida Standards Assessment for English Language Arts or earn a comparable score on the ACT or SAT so they can graduate on time. The goal of ACT SAT Prep is to improve English and reading skills so students can pass the assessment required for graduation. Students will have the opportunity to take the ACT on Sat., July 13th at no cost to them here at SPHS.

Credit Recovery (core academic subjects) - June 3rd to July 18th

This program is for current 9-12 grade students who have failed a core academic course that is required for graduation. Students who need to recover credits use a program called APEX, which allows them to make up failed courses at their own pace, so they can get back on track to graduate.

The purpose of the summer program is to provide learning opportunities during the summer so students who have assessment scores that indicate they are struggling in reading and mathematics will be on a stronger path to success when the 2019-20 school year begins. It is also imperative that students who are behind in credits and are in danger of being retained at the end of summer if they do not make up failed courses attend our Summer Bridge program as well.


ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse from the parent, is required within 48 hours of the absence. Parents may also send an email to excuse their student's absence to <u>StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org</u>. A written excuse should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.









COLLEGE VISITS FOR SENIORS

Do you plan on visiting a college? If so, you must stop by the Main Office, room 101, and pick up a College TDE form. You will need to have all your teachers and parent sign the form and return it to the Main Office three days prior to your visit. Make sure to read the directions on the TDE. You will need to bring back a letter on letterhead from the college you visited, stating the date you attended. The letter will need to be turned in to the Main Office within 2 days of your return. Your absence will then be corrected. College Visits do not count as an absence for exam exemptions.

SENIOR CLASS INFORMATION

Graduation date has been set. It is Friday, May 24th at 1:00pm at Tropicana Field.

We are currently collecting senior dues in room 119. Below you will find a breakdown of the senior dues (fees) for this school year. We currently have about 450 seniors listed as graduating, so we used that as the main number in determining individual costs

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CHOOSING A LOCKER FOR NEXT YEAR!

ALL students who want to use a school locker must purchase an SPHS lock (you <u>cannot</u> use a lock from middle school or one purchased from a store). Locks are for sale in the IB Office for \$5.00 (CASH ONLY PLEASE BRING EXACT CHANGE) and <u>can be re-used each year</u>.

Lock sales and locker assignments will take place in the IB Office (Room 157) from 10am-1pm on the following dates:

- Seniors (Class of 2020): Monday, August 5th (10am-1pm)
- Juniors (Class of 2021): Tuesday, August 6th (10am-1pm)
- **Sophomores (Class of 2022):** Wednesday, August 7th (10am-1pm)
- Freshman (Class of 2023): Thursday, August 8th on this date freshman can <u>select</u>* a locker on 2nd floor (10am-1pm)

*Incoming Freshman (Class of 2023) can also purchase locks and be assigned lockers at Freshman Orientation, <u>however</u>, they will not be able to select a locker location.

DO NOT PLACE A LOCK ON A LOCKER UNTIL YOU HAVE REGISTERED THE LOCK COMBINATION AND LOCKER NUMBER! Locks placed on lockers that are not registered will be removed.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can write a note and the student can go to Student Services, room 135, that morning to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you call or come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the front office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. This will be done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:20 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints on using the proper method of getting your child from class.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the Car Line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please DO NOT enter the Student Parking lot to drop off your child. Students who are dropped off in the student parking lot will receive a detention. If you want to avoid the car line in the morning, you may want to consider turning on to 7th Avenue from 28th Street and dropping students off in front of the gate to the Maintenance area. We do not recommend dropping students off across the street from the school and please do not stop on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off of 5th Ave. as well as 28th St. and 7th Ave.

Thank you so much for your cooperation! Working together we can keep St. Pete High safe!

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NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to put down a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained from the bookkeeper, room 131.

ATTENTION: GOT LUNCH?

We still have about 200 students that have not submitted their application for Free and Reduced Lunch. We are giving those students lunch, but until they have submitted their application online, they will be responsible for all the charges. If you are unsure if you have submitted an application this year, please email rodriguezgonzalezl@pcsb.org and she will check for you. At this time, we have over \$9,000 in outstanding lunch accounts. If you haven't filled out an application, do this as soon as possible to avoid additional charges. You can submit your Free and Reduced application online at www.myschoolbaps.com. This needs to be done at the beginning of every school year. Also, if you need to put additional money on your account, visit www.myschoolbucks.com.

HAVE YOU MOVED?

Did you know that if the school sends you a letter it will NOT be forwarded to your new address? Please do the following steps to change your address:
