

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the Car Line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please DO NOT enter the Student Parking lot to drop off your child. Students who are dropped off in the student parking lot will receive a detention. If you want to avoid the car line in the morning, you may want to consider turning on to 7th Avenue from 28th Street and dropping students off in front of the gate to the Maintenance area. We do not recommend dropping students off across the street from the school and please do not stop on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Avenue as well as 28th Street and 7th Avenue.

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SCHOOL T-SHIRTS

We have SPHS t-shirts available in the main office, \$12 each or three for \$30.00

2019-20 DRESS CODE

TOPS:

- Collared shirt (pullover or button-up)
- St. Pete H.S. approved club or athletic t-shirt.
- All pullovers, sweaters, sweatshirts, jackets and hoodies (if hooded, hood may NOT be worn) must have appropriate shirt underneath (see above).
- All tops must be worn as intended and not tied up, or altered in any way. You may not wear sheer, mesh, oversized (cannot extend below the wrist when arms are held at your side) or undersized (must extend below waistline) tops. Low cut tops are NOT acceptable. Shoulders, stomachs, and backs must be covered.

BOTTOMS:

- All pants/jeans/shorts/skirts must be worn at the waist and be at least knee length or longer. All pants/jeans must be hemmed and/or cuffed. SPHS athletic team issued warm ups may be worn with SPHS approved t-shirt or collared shirt underneath.
- Athletic/Gym shorts are not permitted outside of gym class.
- Absolutely NO form fitting or spandex bottoms skirts, leggings, jeggings, and sweat pants, tights, yoga pants, etc. No knitted, nylon, or athletic style pants/shorts.

- Absolutely no rips, holes, or cuts in clothing.
- Undergarments must NOT be visible.
- No dresses





2019-2020 SUMMER READING FOR TRADITIONAL ENGLISH CLASSES

If you're unsure which classes you're registered for, check your class schedule requests in Focus (click 'My Information', then click 'Class Requests', then change the year to '2019-2020'). Further details - including the unabridged summer reading list and downloadable PDFs of all the summer assignments - are available at http://sphsenglish.com.

English 1, English 1 Honors, English 2, English 3, English 4, and English 4 Florida College Prep:

There is no summer assignment, but you are asked to select a novel of your choice from the "Florida Teens Read" list (bit.ly/SPHSread) to read over the summer; seniors are encouraged to pick a book from College Board's list of "Great Books Recommended for College-Bound Readers" (bit.ly/2G9YOnM).

English 1 Honors:

Select a book from the "Florida Teens Read" list (bit.ly/SPHSread) or one of your own choosing to read over the summer. The texts for this course may include works such as Great Expectations by Charles Dickens, Animal Farm by George Orwell, Sir Gawain and the Green Knight translated by Burton Raffel, and Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare.

English 2 Honors:

The required summer reading text is The Things They Carried by Tim O'Brien. A summer assignment for the novel is due on the first day of school; this handout is available on sphsenglish.com. The texts for the year may include works such as The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald, The Color of Water by James McBride, The Joy Luck Club by Amy Tan, The Secret Life of Bees by Sue Monk Kidd, and Macbeth by Shakespeare.

English 3 Honors:

The required summer reading text is the autobiography Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass; any unabridged edition will do. The summer assignment is due during the first week of school and is available on sphsenglish.com. Other works of literature that you may be reading throughout the school year include Their Eyes Were Watching God by Zora Neale Hurston, The Taming of the Shrew by William Shakespeare, The Scarlet Letter by Nathaniel Hawthorne, Ethan Frome by Edith Wharton, and The Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini.

Composition I & II (Dual Enrollment):

Students entering ENC 1101 (Comp. I) should have read George Orwell's 1984 and John Steinbeck's The Grapes of Wrath by the first day of class. Those entering ENC 1102 (Comp. II) should read Margaret Atwood's The Handmaid's Tale by the first day of that course.

AP English Language and Composition:

Purchase and (on the first day of class) bring the texts English Words from Latin and Greek Elements (2nd ed.) by Donald Ayers and the novel Brave New World by Aldous Huxley. Download the summer assignment from sphsenglish.com and complete it in its entirety; it includes reading a nonfiction novel (chosen from a provided list) and completing a dialectic journal on it as well as reading Thank You for Arguing by Jay Heinrich and completing the accompanying assignment.

English 4 Honors:

The required summer reading is Grendel by John Gardner; the summer assignment is due on the first day of school and is available on sphsenglish.com. Texts for the year may include works such as Beowulf, Hamlet by William Shakespeare, Frankenstein by Mary Shelley, Dracula by Bram Stoker, The Canterbury Tales by Geoffrey Chaucer, and Joseph Conrad's Heart of Darkness.

AP English Literature and Composition:

The two required summer reading texts are Herman Hesse's Siddhartha and Charlotte Brontë's Jane Eyre. Download the summer assignment from sphsenglish.com. Both the assigned reading and other tasks are due on the first day of school. Texts for the year may include William Shakespeare's Hamlet, Charles Dickens' Great Expectations, Alan Moore's Watchmen, Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot, Cormac McCarthy's The Road, Albert Camus' The Stranger, Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, Toni Morrison's Beloved, and Arthur Miller's Death of a Salesman.

AP Capstone Research (Seniors):

A summer assignment was distributed in the final weeks of the AP Seminar class but will also be available for download on sphsenglish.com. If you did not check out a textbook from room 223 before leaving for the summer, email Mr. Benton at bentonro@pcsb.org.

The Green Devil's Pantry & Closet serves any member of the SPHS family when life gets in the way. Clients may receive undergarments, toiletries, cleaning supplies, food, and school supplies. Only 6x8' in size, we accept specific items such as: SPHS labeled shirts and hoodies, collared polo shirts, gently used bras and new underpants and socks. We do not accept other clothing, formal wear, or shoes. Toiletries are always needed with women's deodorant being the biggest "mover", followed by sanitary products, toothbrushes and toothpaste. Bookbag sized lotions (hotel sized) and hand sanitizer plus pocket packs of Kleenex are gratefully accepted. We welcome school supplies, backpacks and makeup bags. Small increment gift cards are useful in allowing Mrs. Keim to buy family-specific items with a copy of the receipt returned to the donor. For food items, it must be easy to open, prepare and eat; such as peanut butter crackers, soups, ramen noodles (particularly those in the cups), Vienna sausages, cereal, granola, cereal bars, nuts, microwave popcorn, macaroni and cheese (boxed), canned pasta of any type, tuna plus mayo and mustard, pre-made meals in a dish, bagged type of juices, and healthy snacks. Nothing needs to be name brand. Think: what would \$5 buy in food that will feed a family and also, if I had only \$5 to spend, what would I need to buy that food stamps might not? How about detergent, hand soap, cleaning supplies, toilet paper and paper towels—all items we might take for granted.



MEDICATION GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL

We encourage all medications to be given at home. However, if a medication is required during school hours, the following guidelines will apply:

Policy and Procedure for medication administration at PCS:

- STUDENTS MAY NOT TRANSPORT MEDICATIONS TO OR FROM SCHOOL. Medications cannot be given to bus assistants to transport to school.
- All parent/guardians must complete a medication form and/or obtain MD signature/order.
- If medications need to be cut, they must be cut prior to bringing them to school.
- Pill crushers, calibrated measuring spoons, soft food for mixing, and special drinks must be provided by a parent/guardian. Physicians order must also specify these directions.
- Parents are required to pick up and sign out any unused or unnecessary medication at the end of the school year or upon request. Be aware that all medications remaining at the end of the school year will be destroyed.
- Over the counter products, including but not limited to non-prescription medication, medicated lip balm, and cough drops, will require both parent signature and written health care provider prescription.
- All medications must be in their original pharmacy or unopened manufacturers container with the equipment necessary to be given (ex: spacer, tubing, mask, etc.)
- Over the counter (OTC) products or medications must have a health care provider order which includes: Student name • Medication name • Specific dosage instructions and time • Signature of MD & phone number
- Narcotics, barbiturates, non-FDA regulated non-prescription herbal products and essential oils/aromatherapy products will not be given at school.
- New medication cards and authorization forms are required each school year.

The following medications may be self-administered:

Inhalers • Epi-Pens • Insulin • Pancreatic enzymes

If there are any questions, please contact your child's school and ask to speak with the school nurse. Thank you for your cooperation and adherence to the Pinellas County School's medication policy.

ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse from the parent, is required within 48 hours of the absence. Parents may also send an email to excuse their student's absence to <u>StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org</u>. A written excuse should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

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COUNSELORS' CORNER

SENIORS:

It's imperative for college bound seniors to take either the ACT or SAT for college entrance, scholarships, or to determine college readiness. Test dates and test sites fill up quickly so it's important for students to complete their registrations ASAP.

<u>Time to apply for college!</u> Students should use the summer to determine when application deadlines are for their prospective colleges and universities. Then they can establish a schedule for themselves to be prepared to meet these deadlines.

<u>College Visits:</u> Seniors who wish to take college visits will need to pick up the appropriate paperwork in the Main Office at least 3 days prior to the visit. Signed documentation of the visit will need to be presented to personnel in the Main Office upon completion of the visit.

Senior Seminars: During early fall, counselors will conduct Senior Seminars where financial aid information will be made available to each student as well as a copy of their transcript at that time.

JUNIORS: Juniors are urged to register and pay for the PSAT/NMSQT which will be administered in October at SPHS. Specific date of the PSAT/NMSQT will be announced in August. Students are to bring a check made out to St. Petersburg High School or the exact change. Students taking the PSAT will have the opportunity to become more aware of SAT directions and questions. The Student Search Service provides students the opportunity to receive information from colleges and universities. Students will be able to enter scholarship competition from the National Merit Corporation.

Juniors are also encouraged to start the college search process. College visits may start during second semester of their junior year. See above senior information.

Juniors who have not passed the FSA/ELA may use concordant scores from the ACT or SAT in its place. See above senior information on how to register.

SOPHOMORES AND FRESHMEN: Please note that all sophomores and freshmen will be taking the PSAT in October to help determine college readiness. There will be no charge for their participation.

DUAL ENROLLMENT STUDENTS: SPC Dual Enrollment students must turn in their SPC Schedule to their counselor by the end of the first week of classes. Meeting this deadline is crucial to their high school transcript being coded correctly. **SCHEDULING:** Students will have only one week at the beginning of the school year to submit a schedule request change form. Make sure to only fill out one form. Schedule changes will occur throughout the first 2 – 3 weeks of the school year. **INFORMATION FOR ALL STUDENTS PURSUING A BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP:** Students who hope to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program must complete service learning

Students who hope to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program must complete service learning hours and turn them in. The necessary forms are available on the counter in Guidance, room 221. Counselors must approve community service projects prior to students logging hours. Students are asked to turn in completed community service hours' logs by the end of April.
