

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CONGRATS TO TEACHER, MR. TENNIAN

Clearwater native and St. Petersburg High School teacher Dave Tennian will be inducted into the Bloomingdale High School Athletic Hall of Fame on September 27.

Tennian grew up in Clearwater, Florida where he started playing soccer as a young boy. From 1980-1984, Tennian started for Clearwater High School and the Clearwater Chargers. Tennian played for the FSU Mens' Soccer Club from 1984-1988 earning First Team All-Metro Conference Tournament honors in 1985. In 2000, Tennian was nominated to Tampa Bay's All-Century Team in the Tampa Bay Times.

Tennian began coaching at Bloomingdale High School in 1990. In 1993 Coach Tennian led the boys' Soccer Team to the first state championship in any sport in the history of the school. Tennian also led the team to state championships in 1995 and 1998, and a state runner-up finish in 1999, as well as top 5 national rankings in 1998 and 1999 and top 7 national rankings in 1993 and 1995. Tennian was named St. Petersburg Times High School Soccer Coach of the Year in 1993, 1995, and 1998 and Tampa Tribune High School Soccer Coach of the Year in 1993 and 1998. On April 27, 1998, Coach Tennian and the Boys Soccer Team were commended for their accomplishments by the State of Florida House of Representatives in House Resolution No. 9501. On Dec. 8, 1999 Tennian was named High School Soccer Coach of the Iteration all-time winning percentage among Florida boys high school soccer coaches and is 9th in the nation in all-time winning percentage.

2019-20 DRESS CODE

TOPS:

- Collared shirt (pullover or button-up)
- St. Pete H.S. approved club or athletic t-shirt.
- All pullovers, sweaters, sweatshirts, jackets and hoodies (if hooded, hood may NOT be worn) must have appropriate shirt underneath (see above).
- All tops must be worn as intended and not tied up, or altered in any way. You may not wear sheer, mesh, oversized (cannot extend below the wrist when arms are held at your side) or undersized (must extend below waistline) tops. Low cut tops are NOT acceptable. Shoulders, stomachs, and backs must be covered.

BOTTOMS:

- All pants/jeans/shorts/skirts must be worn at the waist and be at least knee length or longer. All pants/jeans must be hemmed and/or cuffed. SPHS athletic team issued warm ups may be worn with SPHS approved t-shirt or collared shirt underneath.
- Athletic/Gym shorts are not permitted outside of gym class.
- Absolutely NO form fitting or spandex bottoms skirts, leggings, jeggings, and sweat pants, tights, yoga pants, etc. No knitted, nylon, or athletic style pants/shorts.

GENERAL:

- Absolutely no rips, holes, or cuts in clothing.
- Undergarments must NOT be visible.

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STUDENTS' DELIVERY OF FLOWERS, BALLOONS, ETC.

BUS INFORMATION

Pinellas County Schools Transportation Department is implementing a new system to inform you when your child's bus is going to be delayed or schedule changes. If your student rides the bus this is important to read. SPHS is part of a pilot effort to use a system called Bus Bulletin.

The Bus Bulletin notification system will notify parents and students when there are bus delays and schedule changes. If you would like to receive instant notifications when delays or incidents affect your student's bus, please register with Bus Bulletin.

- All contact information is stored securely and will not be shared or sold. Your privacy is protected.
- Please note: this system is not related to Pinellas County Schools new emergency text message communications through SchoolMessenger.

DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES

Thank you to all the parents who are using the Car Line to drop your students off in the morning and to pick them up in the afternoon. Student safety is our number one priority and using this designated area ensures that all students are out of harm's way.

Please DO NOT enter the Student Parking lot to drop off your child. Students who are dropped off in the student parking lot will receive a detention. If you want to avoid the car line in the morning, you may want to consider turning on to 7th Avenue from 28th Street and dropping students off in front of the gate to the Maintenance area. We do not recommend dropping students off across the street from the school and please do not stop on 5th Avenue and let your child out of the car.

The safe drop-off and pick-up locations are the car circle by Devil's Drive on 27th St. off 5th Ave. as well as 28th St. and 7th Ave.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can write a note and the student can go to Student Services, room 135, that morning to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you call or come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the front office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. This will be done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:30 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints on using the proper method of getting your child from class.

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MEDICATION GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL

We encourage all medications to be given at home. However, if a medication is required during school hours, the following guidelines will apply:

Policy and Procedure for medication administration at PCS:

- STUDENTS MAY NOT TRANSPORT MEDICATIONS TO OR FROM SCHOOL. Medications cannot be given to bus assistants to transport to school.
- All parent/guardians must complete a medication form and/or obtain MD signature/order.
- If medications need to be cut, they must be cut prior to bringing them to school.
- Pill crushers, calibrated measuring spoons, soft food for mixing, and special drinks must be provided by a parent/guardian. Physicians order must also specify these directions.
- Parents are required to pick up and sign out any unused or unnecessary medication at the end of the school year or upon request. Be aware that all medications remaining at the end of the school year **will be destroyed.**
- Over the counter products, including but not limited to non-prescription medication, medicated lip balm, and cough drops, will require both parent signature and written health care provider prescription.
- All medications must be in their original pharmacy or unopened manufacturers container with the equipment necessary to be given (ex: spacer, tubing, mask, etc.)
- Over the counter (OTC) products or medications must have a health care provider order which includes:
 - ✓ Student name
 ✓ Medication name
- ✓ Specific dosage instructions and time
 ✓ Signature of MD and phone number
- Narcotics, barbiturates, non-FDA regulated non-prescription herbal products and essential oils/aromatherapy products will not be given at school.

• New medication cards and authorization forms are required each school year.

The following medications may be self-administered:


- ✓ Inhalers
- ✓ Epi-Pens
- ✓ Insulin
- Pancreatic enzymes

If there are any questions, please contact your child's school and ask to speak with the school nurse. Thank you for your cooperation and adherence to the Pinellas County School's medication policy.

ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse from the parent, is required within 48 hours of the absence. Parents may also send an email to excuse their student's absence to StPetersburgHS. Absence@pcsb.org. A written excuse should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.



NEED TO USE THE ELEVATOR?

If you ever need to use the elevator at school, you will need to bring in a doctor's note stating how long the elevator will be required. Before the elevator key is issued the student will have to put down a \$20.00 deposit that will be returned by check in the mail once the key is returned. Elevator keys can be obtained in the bookkeeping office.

FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH INFORMATION

Pinellas County Schools Food Service Application for Free and Reduced Price Meals is needed for the **2019/2020 School Year. If you have already completed a lunch form, disregard this reminder notice.** If we have not received your application by September 26th, beginning September 27th you will need to provide a lunch for your child or you may purchase school lunch at the following rates: Lunch is \$2.75 per day.

- Federal regulations require a new application be submitted each school year.
- Free or Reduced meals are not permitted without a processed application. This includes Food Stamps/TANF.

- Notification of status (Free, Reduced Price or Paid) will be emailed or will be sent home with your child.
- Incomplete applications will delay processing.
