- English 1 Honors Select a book from the "Florida Teens Read" list (bit.ly/readSPHS) or one of your own choosing to read over the summer. The texts for this course may include works such as Great Expectations by Charles Dickens, Animal Farm by George Orwell, Sir Gawain and the Green Knight translated by Burton Raffel, and Romeo and Juliet by William Shakespeare.
- English 2 Regular Select a book from the "Florida Teens Read" list (bit.ly/readSPHS) or one of your own choosing to read over the summer. Books that will be read during the school year may include works such as The Great Gatsby by F. Scott Fitzgerald, Macbeth by William Shakespeare, The Secret Life of Bees by Sue Monk Kidd, Unwind by Neal Shusterman, Night by Elie Wiesel, Maus by Art Spiegelman, Lord of the Flies by William Golding, and When the Legends Die by Hal Borland.

A summer assignment for the novel is due on the first day of school; this handout is available on sphsenglish. com . The texts for the year may include works such as *The Great Gatsby* by F. Scott Fitzgerald, *The Color of Water* by James McBride, *The Joy Luck Club* by Amy Tan, *The Secret Life of Bees* by Sue Monk Kidd, and *Macbeth* by Shakespeare.
- English 3 Regular Select a book from the "Florida Teens Read" list (bit.ly/readSPHS) or one of your own choosing to read over the summer. Texts that will be read during the school year may include The Crucible by Arthur Miller, A Streetcar Named Desire by Tennessee Williams, Into Thin Air by Jon Krakauer, The Tempest by William Shakespeare, The Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini, and The Glass Castle by Jeannette Walls.
- English 3 Honors The required summer reading text is the autobiography Narrative of the Life of Frederick Douglass; any unabridged edition will do. The summer assignment is due during the first week of school and is available on sphsenglish.com. Other works of literature that you may be reading throughout the school year include Their Eyes Were Watching God by Zora Neale Hurston, The Taming of the Shrew by William Shakespeare, The Scarlet Letter by Nathaniel Hawthorne, Ethan Frome by Edith Wharton, and The Kite Runner by Khaled Hosseini.
- Composition I & II (Dual Enrollment) Students entering ENC 1101 (Comp. I) should have read George Orwell's 1984 and John Steinbeck's The Grapes of Wrath by the first day of class. Those entering ENC 1102 (Comp. II) should read Margaret Atwood's The Handmaid's Tale by the first day of that course.
- AP English Language and Composition Purchase and (on the first day of class) bring the texts English Words from Latin and Greek Elements (2nd ed.) by Donald Ayers and the novel Brave New World by Aldous Huxley. Please read one of the following books of your choice:

- AP English Literature and Composition The required summer reading text is Charlotte Brontë's Jane Eyre. Having completed the assigned reading is due on the first day of school. Texts for the year may include William Shakespeare's Hamlet, Charles Dickens' Great Expectations, Alan Moore's Watchmen, Toni Morrison's Beloved, Samuel Beckett's Waiting for Godot, Cormac McCarthy's The Road, Albert Camus' The Stranger, Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, Arthur Miller's Death of a Salesman, and Ian McEwan's Atonement.
- <u>AP Capstone Seminar (Juniors)</u> While there is no summer assignment for this course, please read the College Board's course description (bit.ly/2b2Zevu) for AP Seminar in preparation for the first day of class.
- AP Capstone Research (Seniors) Students who come into the AP Research class with their draft research question and a handful of pieces of existing research related to their topic are much more likely to be successful in obtaining an AP Capstone Certificate or AP Capstone Diploma. The summer assignment is available for download on sphsenglish.com.


MENTOR WORKSHOPS WEBINAR

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COUNSELORS' CORNER

SENIORS

During early fall, counselors will conduct Senior Seminars where financial aid information will be made available to each student as well as a copy of their transcript at that time. We will also review graduation requirements and post-grad options.

It's imperative for college bound seniors to take either the ACT or SAT for college entrance, scholarships, or to determine college readiness. Test dates and test sites fill up quickly so it's important for students to complete their registrations ASAP.

SCHOOL DAY SAT

Class of 2021 may opt-in to take the SAT at no cost on Wednesday, September 23, 2020. Students can go to the "Advance Studies and Academic Excellence" page on PCSB website to register. Class of 2022 will take the SAT on Wednesday, March 3, 2021.

TIME TO APPLY FOR COLLEGE!

Students should use the summer to determine when application deadlines are for their prospective colleges and universities. Then they can establish a schedule for themselves to be prepared to meet these deadlines.

COLLEGE VISITS

Seniors who wish to take college visits will need to pick up the appropriate paperwork in the Main Office at least 3 days prior to the visit. Signed documentation of the visit will need to be presented to personnel in the Main Office upon completion of the visit.

JUNIORS

Juniors are urged to register and pay for the PSAT/NMSQT which will be administered in October at SPHS. Specific date of the PSAT/NMSQT will be announced in August. Students are to bring a check made out to St. Petersburg High School or the exact change. Students taking the PSAT will have the opportunity to become more aware of SAT directions and questions. The Student Search Service provides students the opportunity to receive information from colleges and universities. Students will be able to enter scholarship competition from the National Merit Corporation.

Juniors are also encouraged to start the college search process. College visits may start during second semester of their junior year. See above senior information.

Juniors who have not passed the FSA/ELA may use concordant scores from the ACT or SAT in its place. See above senior information on how to register.

SOPHOMORES AND FRESHMEN

Please note that all sophomores and freshmen will be taking the PSAT in October to help determine college readiness. There will be no charge for their participation.

SCHEDULING


Students will have only one week at the beginning of the school year to submit a schedule request change form. Make sure to only fill out one form. Schedule changes will occur throughout the first 2-3 weeks of the school year.

INFORMATION FOR ALL STUDENTS PURSUING A BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

Students who hope to qualify for the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program must complete service learning hours and turn them in. The necessary forms are available on the counter in Guidance, room 221. Counselors must approve community service projects prior to students logging hours. Students are asked to turn in completed community service hours' logs by the beginning of May.

CHECK OUT PROCEDURES

Parents requesting early check-out of their student can write a note and the student can go to Student Services, room 135, that morning to get a Permit to Leave slip. This alleviates any wait time for you when you come to pick up your student. If you call or come in, please understand that we do need time to get your student for you. Please allow at least 30 minutes. This will give the school the opportunity to look up the student's schedule and send for them to meet you in the front office. Parents, it is important that we check the driver's license of anyone picking up your student early from school. This will be done to ensure the safety of your child. After 1:30 pm there will be no permission to leave slips written, due to the time constraints on using the proper method of getting your child from class.

SECOND ANNUAL SPHS ART SHOW – FIRST VIRTUAL!

The CAS Project has been the catalyst for the SPHS Art Show since its inception in 2018. The project, a required component for graduation in the IB Diploma Program, encourages students to be involved in Creative thinking, Action that contributes to a healthy lifestyle and Service that is a voluntary exchange with learning benefits for the student.

Students complete activities that allow their learning to extend beyond the classroom. Many students fulfill their CAS requirements through service projects. As a result of the rigorous academic requirements for the IB diploma, students do not have the availability for Fine Arts courses beyond their sophomore year. Therefore, artistic students in grades 11 and 12 do not have a formal outlet for art. By combining their desire to give back to the art program and be a part of the Visual Arts department, students merged the CAS project with the art department. A winning partnership was created between IB students and fine art instructors to showcase the art of traditional students, raise funds for the arts and bring it all to the community of St. Petersburg.

This year's CAS project was solely produced by junior, Athena Symonette who discovered a love of coding in her ITGS class (Information Technology in a Global Society). An art lover and accomplished artist herself, Athena felt the arts weren't being presented, and wanted to bring awareness to it. Throughout the school year, plans and efforts were made for another art show similar to last year's success with over 300 works of art displayed, and some 250 community members attended. With an original show date slated for late March, the current pandemic cancelled all show plans. Not to be discouraged, Ms. Symonette relished the opportunity to put those coding skills to use, and the first ever SPHS Virtual Art Show was born.

Tracie Bolack, the 2D Art & Design teacher connected Athena with the art works and is heard to be "busting with pride" and gratitude. Ms. Bolack said "I am so grateful to Athena for her dogged positivity and sound work ethic. She was not giving up, and I didn't have the heart to let her down, so here we are! My greatest take away from this year's show is the closure it provides for my students. They can review all the work they have done this year, remember our time spent in class together and feel a real sense of accomplishment that is difficult to come by in this time of separation".

MEDICATION GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL

We encourage all medications to be given at home. However, if a medication is required during school hours, the following guidelines will apply:

Policy and Procedure for medication administration at PCS:

- STUDENTS MAY NOT TRANSPORT MEDICATIONS TO OR FROM SCHOOL. Medications cannot be given to bus assistants to transport to school.
- All parent/guardians must complete a medication form and/or obtain MD signature/order.
- If medications need to be cut, they must be cut prior to bringing them to school.
- Pill crushers, calibrated measuring spoons, soft food for mixing, and special drinks must be provided by a parent/guardian.
 Physicians order must also specify these directions.
- Parents are required to pick up and sign out any unused or unnecessary medication at the end of the school year or upon request. Be aware that all medications remaining at the end of the school year will be destroyed.
- Over the counter products, including but not limited to nonprescription medication, medicated lip balm, and cough drops, will require both parent signature and written health care provider prescription.
- All medications must be in their original pharmacy or unopened manufacturers container with the equipment necessary to be given (ex: spacer, tubing, mask, etc.)
- Over the counter (OTC) products or medications must have a health care provider order which includes:
 - √ Student name
 - √ Medication name
 - √ Specific dosage instructions and time
 - √ Signature of MD and phone number
- Narcotics, barbiturates, non-FDA regulated non-prescription herbal products and essential oils/aromatherapy products will not be given at school.
- New medication cards and authorization forms are required each school year.

The following medications may be self-administered:

- / Inhalers √ Insulin
- √ Epi-Pens
 √ Pancreatic enzymes

If there are any questions, please contact your child's school and ask to speak with the school nurse. Thank you for your cooperation and adherence to the Pinellas County School's medication policy.

ABSENCES

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse from the parent, is required within 48 hours of the absence. Parents may also send an email to excuse their student's absence to **StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org**. A written excuse should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays.

NOTE: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.

STUDENTS' DELIVERY OF FLOWERS, BALLOONS, ETC.

With safety in mind, the school cannot accept any type of flower arrangement, balloon bouquets or balloon arrangements for delivery to students. Many times, these gifts are in glass containers which can be broken. In addition, they cause class disruption. Please do not send any type of delivery to students here at school.
