# **BUS INFORMATION**

Pinellas County Schools Transportation Department is implementing a new system to inform you when your child's bus is going to be delayed or schedule changes. If your student rides the bus this is important to read. SPHS is part of a pilot effort to use a system called Bus Bulletin.

The Bus Bulletin notification system will notify parents and students when there are bus delays and schedule changes. If you would like to receive instant notifications when delays or incidents affect your student's bus, please register with Bus Bulletin.

- There is no cost to you for this service.
- Registration is simple and fast.
- You can choose to receive either text messages, phone calls, and e-mails or all these options.
- All contact information is stored securely and will not be shared or sold. Your privacy is protected.
- Please note: this system is not related to Pinellas County Schools new emergency text message communications through SchoolMessenger.

Athletes should check with their counselor regarding credit recovery that aligns with NCAA eligibility requirements.

# COLLEGE VISITS

Juniors and seniors looking for their "perfect fit" for higher education are encouraged to take college visits. They should go to the Front Office to pick up and fill out a TDE form PRIOR to the trip. Proof of the visit must be provided to Ms. Middleton in the Front Office upon return to receive an excused absence. A total of 4 "College Days" are allowed. For IB students, please pick up your TDE from Ms. Derrickson in the IB Office.

# **PSAT FOLLOW UP:**

All 9th, 10th, 11th graders took the PSAT in October, the scores are available now online and can be accessed following the directions listed below. Counselors will be following up with students during classroom visits end of January/beginning of February.

- Go to studentscores.collegeboard.org.
- 2. Click "Sign Up" under the Sign In spaces.
- Input your personal information under "Create Your Student Account."
  - Once students have set up their College Board account, they will need to log in to the account to access score information. Students should enter their username and password (at studentscores.collegeboard.org). They will be redirected to their SAT Suite of Assessments score-reporting portal, with their most recent
  - If their most recent test is missing, they can use the "Missing Scores" link to update their personal information and provide their access code or student ID that will match their scores to their account.
- When students log in to their College Board account, they will be taken to a dashboard (entry) screen that includes their scores, links to SAT practice, AP and core course work, and information about Student Search Service and career profiles.
- The first thing they will see on the dashboard is their most recent scores. The total score for PSAT/NMSQT ranges from 320 to 1520. It is the sum of their Math section score added to their Evidence-Based Reading and Writing section score. When students click "View Details," they will be taken to their detailed score reports.

# **ABSENCES**

If you are absent from school, a doctor's note, phone call or written excuse (from the parent must be emailed to StPetersburgHS.Absence@pcsb.org.), is required to be sent within 48 hours of the absence. The email should include the student's name, reason for absence, and parent telephone number. A parent may excuse 5 days in a semester. Further absences cannot be excused without a doctor's note. Absences should be for the following reasons: student illness, family emergency, death in family, medical appointments, and religious holidays. Note: The Florida Legislature has enacted requirements that schools report to the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles (DHSMV) the names of students who fail to satisfy the attendance requirements. This refers to students who accumulate 15 unexcused absences (excludes out-of-school suspension) within 90 calendar days. Students who fail to satisfy attendance requirements will be INELIGIBLE for driving privileges.



The Absolutely Free Student Checking account is designed for individual MIDFLORIDA members 10-20 years old. Depending on age, the account may require a parent or guardian's signature. Identification (school or government-issued ID) required to open account. Offer valid as of April 1, 2020 and may be canceled at any time without notice. Membership required. A minimum deposit of \$25 is required to open the Absolutely Free Student Checking accounts. Anyone who has held a checking account with MIDFLORIDA in the past year will not qualify for the \$25 incentive. No dividends are paid on Absolutely Free Student Checking accounts. Anyone who has held a checking account with MIDFLORIDA in the past year will not qualify for the \$25 incentive. No dividends are paid on Absolutely Free Student Checking. Annual Percentage Yield is 0.00%. To receive the \$25 incentive, you must complete five debit card purchase transactions within the first 45 days. Once the qualifications have been met, \$25 will be deposited into the account on the 46th day and will be reported to the IRS. See associate for details regarding terms and fees.

# **DUAL ENROLLMENT AT ST. PETERSBURG COLLEGE**

St. Petersburg College offers college classes to qualified high school students in Pinellas County at no cost to the student. These courses allow students to earn credits toward a high school diploma and a college degree. Dual enrollment course grades are recorded to the student's high school transcript and his/her permanent college transcript. Therefore, students must give their best performance in dual enrollment coursework because the resulting grades can greatly impact post-secondary education opportunities, scholarship opportunities, and financial aid eligibility.

Courses on the Dual Enrollment Approved Course List are available on SPC campuses and some local high school campuses. Dual enrollment courses that are offered by a credentialed instructor at a student's high school must be taken on the high school campus.

# To take Dual Enrollment classes through SPC during the first semester, students must:

- See their school counselor to see if they qualify
- 2. Get directions to obtain SPC ID number (share with counselor).
- 3. Take the PERT, SAT, or ACT prior to obtaining permission to take dual enrollment courses.
- 4. Students eligible for on-campus Dual Enrollment courses will have an opportunity to register for on-campus dual enrollment courses during the in-house registration in the month of February. Please see your School Counselor for more information regarding eligibility requirements for Dual Enrollment.
- 5. Obtain a completed Dual Enrollment Permission Form (for off campus classes.)
- Register for the class(es) through the SPC Dual Enrollment Office (for off campus classes) no later than one week after the last day of school.

\*To be eligible to take an academic dual enrollment course a student must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 3.0. To be eligible to take a career dual enrollment course, a student must have a minimum unweighted cumulative GPA of 2.0.

# **EARLY COLLEGE/EARLY ADMISSION:**

Students who are interested in being a full-time Early College or Early Admission student must complete the application and submit to the Early College Program office by 2:00pm on February 10, 2021.

Full-time Early College or Early Admissions students must follow steps 1 – 3 listed above to enroll. Interested students should visit SPC website - www.spcollege.edu for more information.

# **DUAL ENROLLMENT AT PINELLAS TECHNICAL COLLEGE**

High school students attending Pinellas Technical College (PTC) have the opportunity to be dual enrolled in postsecondary courses tuition free! These courses give students credits toward a high school diploma and a career technical certificate. Hours completed at PTC may also transfer as credit hours to local and state colleges.

Dual enrollment students will be present in the same class as adult students; therefore, a higher level of maturity, independence, and initiative is important for student success.

Students who are registered for dual enrollment courses will have three grades per semester recorded on their high school transcript. Therefore, students will need to work hard and commit to academic excellence as they perform at their best with the required PTC coursework. Please keep in mind that the resulting grades can greatly impact postsecondary education opportunities and/or scholarship opportunities.

In order to take Dual Enrollment classes at PTC during the fall and spring semester, students must:

- Be at least 16 years old and entering their junior or senior year in high school
- Have a minimum cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.0, or 2.5 GPA for medical-related programs
- Show responsibility through high school attendance and behavior.
- Obtain a Dual Enrollment Application from their high school counselor.
- Return completed application to their high school counselor, with all necessary signatures. \*Once the PTC counselor has received the application, the student will be contacted regarding a shadowing date.

# MEDICATION GUIDELINES FOR SCHOOL

We encourage all medications to be given at home. However, if a medication is required during school hours, the following guidelines will apply.

# POLICY & PROCEDURE FOR

# MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION AT PCS: • STUDENTS MAY NOT TRANSPORT

- MEDICATIONS TO OR FROM SCHOOL.

  Medications cannot be given to bus assistants to
- transport to school.
   All parent/guardians must complete a medication form and/or obtain MD signature/order.
- If medications need to be cut, they must be cut prior to bringing them to school.
- Pill crushers, calibrated measuring spoons, soft food for mixing, and special drinks must be provided by a parent/guardian. Physicians order must also specify these directions.
- Parents are required to pick up and sign out any unused or unnecessary medication at the end of the school year or upon request. Be aware that all medications remaining at the end of the school year will be destroyed.
- Over the counter products, including but not limited to non-prescription medication, medicated lip balm, and cough drops, will require both parent signature and written health care provider prescription.
- All medications must be in their original pharmacy or unopened manufacturers container with the equipment necessary to be given (ex: spacer, tubing, mask, etc.)
- Over the counter (OTC) products or medications must have a health care provider order which includes:
  - 1. Student name
  - Medication name
  - 3. Specific dosage instructions and time
  - 4. Signature of MD and phone number
- Narcotics, barbiturates, non-FDA regulated nonprescription herbal products and essential oils/ aromatherapy products will not be given at school.
- New medication cards and authorization forms are required each school year.
- The following medications may be selfadministered:
  - Inhalers
  - Epi-Pens
  - Insulin
  - Pancreatic enzymes

If there are any questions, please contact your child's school and ask to speak with the school nurse. Thank you for your cooperation and adherence to the Pinellas County School's medication policy.


